Local Rule 131
COUNSEL IDENTIFICATION AND SIGNATURE

The name, address, telephone number, and the California State Bar membership number of all counsel (or, if in propria persona, of the party) and the specific identification of each party represented by name and interest in the litigation (e.g., plaintiff Smith, defendant Jones) shall appear in the upper left-hand corner of the first page of each document presented for filing, except that in instance of multi-party representation reference may be made to the signature page for the complete list of parties represented. See LR 180, 182.

All pleadings or other documents shall be signed by the individual attorney for the party presenting them, or by the party involved if that party is appearing in propria persona. The name of the person signing the document shall be typed underneath the signature. See FRCivP 11.

(e) **Standards of Professional Conduct.** Every member of the bar of this Court, and any attorney permitted to practice in this Court under subsection (b) shall become familiar and comply with the standards of professional conduct required of members of the State Bar of California and contained in the State Bar Act, the Rules of Professional Conduct of the State Bar of California, and decisions of any Court applicable thereto, which are hereby adopted as standards of professional conduct in this court. In the absence of an applicable standard therein, the Model Code of Professional Responsibility of the American Bar Association may be considered for guidance. No attorney admitted to practice before this court shall engage in any conduct which degrades or impunes the integrity of the court or in any manner interferes with the administration of justice.
