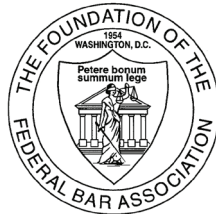


Equal Justice Under The Law

Equal justice under the law is a phrase engraved on the front of the U.S. Supreme Court in Washington, D.C. It is also a societal ideal that has influenced the American legal system.

Equal Protection under the Law is a phrase in the 14th Amendment to the US. Constitution requiring the states guarantee the same rights, privileges and protections to all citizens.

The clause which took effect in 1868, provides that no state shall deny to any person within its jurisdiction "the equal protection of the laws."
