2017 Collateral Forfeiture Schedule

(Effective January 1, 2017)

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FORFEITURE OF COLLATERAL IN LIEU OF APPEARANCE

(a) Forfeiture of Collateral - Generally

This collateral forfeiture schedule applies only to petty and misdemeanor offenses (Class A, B and C misdemeanors and infractions only, as defined under 18 U.S.C. § 3559) committed in the Eastern District of California and promulgated pursuant to Fed. R. Crim. P. 58(d)(1) Any criminal provision which includes both misdemeanors and felony provision in this schedule is only intended to refer to the misdemeanor provisions. This collateral fine schedule cannot be used on any felony violation, even if the statue itself is referred to in this collateral schedule.

Persons charged with certain misdemeanors may, in lieu of personal appearance, post collateral in the amount indicated for the offense, waive appearance before a magistrate judge, and consent to forfeiture of collateral, unless the charging document makes the appearance mandatory.

(b) Forfeiture of Collateral Schedule

Unless this schedule or the charging document makes the appearance mandatory, all other offenses are eligible for collateral to be posted and forfeited in lieu of appearance.

(c) Excluded Offenses

A person charged with an offense requiring a Mandatory Appearance (MA) may not be permitted to post collateral, waive appearance before a magistrate judge, and consent to forfeiture of collateral.

(d) Maximum Penalties in Lieu of Forfeiture of Collateral

If a person charged with an offense under subsection (a) hereof fails to post and forfeit collateral, a punishment, including fine, CVB processing fee, special assessment (18 USC 3013), imprisonment or probation, may be imposed within the limits established by law upon conviction by plea or after trial.

(e) Failure to Appear

If a person charged with an offense under subsection (a) hereof fails to post and forfeit collateral, and then fails to appear for a duly scheduled hearing on the offense charged, and a showing is made consistent with the provisions of Fed. R. Crim. P. 58(d)(3), then the magistrate judge may issue a warrant of arrest for that person and may increase the collateral fine on the offense to *twice* the amount listed in the collateral fine schedule, but such amount shall be no more than the maximum fine allowed by law.

Upon receipt of the warrant of arrest, the United States Marshal for this District may, in lieu of execution thereof, give written notice to the person that a warrant of arrest has issued for his or her arrest, and may state in the notice that the warrant of arrest will not be executed if, within ten (10) days of the notice, (1) the person voluntarily presents himself or herself before the

magistrate judge during usual business hours for the purpose of scheduling a hearing on the charged offense; or (2) the person remits as collateral to be posted and forfeited the entire monetary fine amount, including any increased collateral fine amount for their failure to appear, set forth in the charging document.

In the event that the person properly appears before the magistrate judge, or properly remits and forfeits the collateral, including the increased amount for failure to appear, as hereinabove set forth, then the magistrate judge must vacate the warrant of arrest; if the person fails to appear or remit as stated above, the United States Marshal may execute the warrant of arrest consistent with applicable law.

(f) Mandatory Appearances

In all cases where a bail amount is listed, a mandatory appearance may be required at the discretion of the citing officer when:

- 1) Mandatory Appearance ("MA") is listed in the alternative to a bail;
- 2) The commission of the offense involved loss or damage to the property of the United States or another;
- 3) The commission of the offense involved a threat to the safety and/or welfare of others;
- 4) The offender has committed or has been charged with the same or similar offense(s) on prior occasion(s); and/or
- 5) The offense being cited is not listed in the collateral forfeiture schedule herein.

(g) Assimilated Crimes Act Cases

For those petty offense or misdemeanor cases falling under the Assimilated Crimes Act cases (18 U.S.C. § 13), when adopting State Regulations or State Bail, the citing officer must use the "Base Fine" amount of the *current* California Bail and Penalty Schedule at the time of the offense, which is incorporated herein, except for the specific assimilated state offenses listed in the Appendix. Only the "Base Fine" shall be applied since California's scheme of restitution, fines, penalty assessments, and fees are not assimilated through the Assimilative Crimes Act.

It is not practical to list all possible California crimes or regulations that are assimilated herein. The most common are listed in the Appendix with the corresponding suggested collateral forfeiture. Since this list is not inclusive, it may be subject to change from time to time. If the Appendix does not include the assimilated crime or regulation, the "Base Fine" amount of the State Bail Schedule must be utilized or, alternatively, MA, if appropriate.

(h) Abbreviations

As used in this collateral forfeiture schedule, the term "MA" means "Mandatory Appearance"; "C" means "commercial"; NC means "non-commercial" and "NTE" means "Not to Exceed."

(i) Wildlife/Property Forfeiture Order

Unless otherwise specifically ordered by a United States Court, any wildlife or property which has been seized under the authority of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, 16 USC 703-711; the National Wildlife Refuge Systems Administrative Act, 16 USC 721-731; The Eagle Protection Act, 16 USC 668-668e; The Endangered Species Act, 16 USC 1531-1542; The Migratory Waterfowl Hunting Stamp Act, 16 USC 1361-1407; the Tariff Classification Act, 19 USC 1202; The Lacey Act, 18 USC 42, The Lacey Act Amendments, 16 USC 3371-3378; The American Antiquities Act, 16 USC 433; the African Elephant Conservation Act, 16 USC 4201-4245, The Archeological Resource Protection Act, 16 USC 470aa, et seq.; and The Wild Bird Conservation Act, 16 USC 4901-4916, where in the final disposition of the case has been made by either payment of a forfeiture of collateral or a judgment by the Court on behalf of the government and where so authorized by statute, such wildlife or property shall be forfeited to the U.S. Government and disposed of by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in the manner prescribed by Title 50, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 12.
