
On April 14, 2020, on ex parte request of the United States, this court issued General Order No. 615, temporarily staying civil matters involving the Commissioner of Social Security as a party under 42 U.S.C. § 405(g) and (h) (Social Security Matters) due to the COVID-19 public health emergency and the inability of the Commissioner of Social Security (Commissioner) to prepare and file a certified copy of the administrative record (CAR), “including the evidence upon which the findings and decision complained of are based,” 42 U.S.C. § 405(g) until such time as the Commissioner could resume preparation of CARs.

The court, having now been informed by the United States that preparation of CARs has resumed, that the Commissioner is working through the backlog, and that they therefore recommend lifting the stay in the March to April time frame, hereby rescinds the court’s temporary stay in Social Security Matters effective April 1, 2022, without further order of this court.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
