

GENERAL ORDER NO. 138

Good cause appearing:


IT IS ORDERED, effective nunc pro tunc to November 18, 1981, that the following amendments to Local Rule 9 are hereby adopted:


"(a) (1) (a) In criminal and civil matters occurring before the magistrates, the United States may be represented by a qualified attorney as set forth in paragraph 1, above, by a student enrolled in a course of study at a law school accredited by the State Bar of California, or by an employee of the United States Government. Persons permitted to practice in the magistrate's court are subject to the jurisdiction of the magistrate with respect to their conduct to the same extent as members of the bar of this court."

"(b) (5) Students enrolled in a course of study at a law school accredited by the State Bar of California may appear before the magistrate, under the auspices of the Federal Public Defender, for the purpose of representing criminal defendants in misdemeanor cases."
