GENERAL ORDER NO. 204

In accordance with a resolution approved by the Judicial Conference of the United States at its September, 1986 meeting, which states:

"Effective October 1, 1986, as temporary relief for United States Court Reporters, the following (are the) increased maximum allowable transcript rates, subject to the further action of the Judicial Conference thereon following committee reports on said rates. Provided further that said maximum allowable rates will not apply as to any transcripts paid for by the government  $^1$  as long as Gramm/Rudman/Hollings  $^2$  is in effect:"

aforementioned rates effective October 1, 1986.
