ORDER AMENDING PLAN FOR REPRESENTATION OF INDIGENT DEFENDANTS PURSUANT TO CRIMINAL JUSTICE ACT OF 1964

GENERAL ORDER NO. 28

WHEREAS, General Order No. 20, September 19, 1966, adopted a plan for representation of indigent defendants pursuant to the Criminal Justice Act of 1964, for the Eastern District of California;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the said plan is hereby amended by deletion of item 4 of Section III, paragraph A, by inserting the following:

- 4. Since the Commissioners (other than in Sacramento and Fresno) are generally far removed from the places of holding court in the district, the plan proceeds on the premise that if an attorney is requested, in these outlying places for representation before the Commissioner, that an appointment of a local attorney will be made by the Commissioner for further proceedings before the Commissioner and until relieved by order of the district court; but that "trial counsel" will be appointed by the District Judge from the area or place where the trial will be held.
