General Order No. 36 adopted by this Court June 30, 1971, is amended to read as follows:

Persons charged with violation of any petty offense indicated on the attached schedule, occurring within the territorial jurisdiction of a United States Magistrate, may, if permitted by the issuing officer, post collateral for the offense in lieu of personal appearance and consent to forfeiture of collateral.

Such collateral shall be collected by the clerk of the Eastern District Central Violations Bureau, Sacramento, California, and if not paid within the time specified, collateral may be increased by the clerk of the Central Violations Bureau upon direction of the full-time magistrate.

In traffic offenses a forfeiture of bail shall be equivalent to a conviction, and the clerk of the Central Violations Bureau, or a magistrate's clerk may certify

the record of any conviction of a traffic violation, as may be requested by a proper state authority.

Any person who has not attained the age of 18 on the date of the alleged violation, or who cannot furnish proof of such age when asked by the citing officer, may be required to appear before a Magistrate accompanied by a parent or guardian.



311.0 Determination of the Secretary.

The Secretary of the Army having determined that the use of certain lake and reservoir areas by the general public for boating, swimming, bathing, fishing, and other recreational purposes will not be contrary to the public interest and will not be inconsistent with the operation and maintenance of the lake or reservoir for their primary purposes, hereby prescribes the following rules and regulations pursuant to the provision of section 4 of the Act of Congress approved December 22, 1944, as amended (16 U.S.C. 460d.), for the public use of certain lake and reservoir areas. Such public use is also subject to applicable State, local, and other Federal laws and regulations.

311.1 Areas covered.

(a) The regulations contained in this part shall be applicable to:

(a) No boat, barge or other vessel shall be placed upon or operated upon any water of the lake or reservoir for a fee or profit, either as a direct charge to a second party, or as an incident to other services provided to a second party, except as specifically authorized by lease, license, or concession contract with the Department of the Army, or except for commercial navigation on a lake or reservoir which is navigable by law.

(b) All such watercraft authorized for commercial service, including rental units, shall have the maximum passenger carrying capacity (number of persons authorized by State and local law and/or in the absence thereof by ratings figured on Outboard Boating Club manufacturers rating) plainly posted in a conspicuous place inside the watercraft.

311.3 Boats and other vessels, private.

(a) The operation of boats, houseboats, cabin cruisers and other vessels on the lake or reservoir for fishing and recreational use is permitted except in prohibited areas as contained in regulations in this part and as designated by the District Engineer in charge of the project.

The District Engineer may require the applicant for a permit to furnish the construction plans and other information pertaining to the construction and equipment of the boat or other vessel prior to issuing a permit for its operation on the lake or reservoir. All boats permitted on the lake or reservoir shall be equipped for safe operation and operated in a safe manner in accordance with instructions issued by the District Engineer. These instructions may provide that the operation of speed boats and water skiing activities shall be confined to areas of water designated by the District Engineer for such activities.

(d) Houseboats, cabin cruisers, and other vessels may be placed and operated on the lakes and reservoirs, except that such a facility shall not be utilized for human habitation at a fixed or permanent mooring point and if equipped with toilets and galley shall not be placed on lakes and reservoirs with small permanent pools, or where prohibited by State and/or local laws and regulations. Such vessels may be barred from other lakes and reservoirs by the District Engineer with the concurrence of the Chief of Engineers in those lakes and reservoirs in which the waters thereof are used for domestic water supply when the District Engineer determines that such use is contrary to the public health and safety.

311.4 Mooring, care and sanitation of boats and floating facilities.

(a) All boats or other vessels when not in actual use must be either removed from the lake or reservoir, securely moored at authorized docks or boathouses where supervision by the owner or his representative is provided on a 24-hour-day basis or placed in the care of a marina concessionaire, State or local managing agency or other party authorized to care for floating equipment on a 24-hour-day basis.

(b) All boats, barges, and other vessels or floating facilities will be moored only in locations designated by the District Engineer or his designated representative. All floating

or stationary mooring facilities will be constructed in accordance with approved plans and specifications and will require a permit, lease or license approved by the District Engineer or his designated representative. He shall have authority to revoke such permits, leases or licenses and require removal of the facility for failure of the permittee, lessee or licensee to comply with the terms and conditions of the permit, lease, or license or with the regulations in this part.

(c) The discharge of sewage, garbage, or other pollutants in the waters of the lake or reservoir from any boat, barge, or other vessel on the reservoir is prohibited except in accordance with regulations of the Environmental Protection Agency, State and local health agencies permitting such discharge when underway in deep waters other than embayments. All such pollutants shall be deposited ashore at places designated for such deposit and disposal.

311.5 Swimming and bathing.

Swimming and bathing are permitted except in prohibited areas designated by the District Engineer or State and local health authorities.

311.6 Hunting and fishing.

(a) Hunting, fishing, and trapping are permitted in accordance with all applicable Federal, State and local laws for the protection of fish and game except in prohibited areas including the following:

(1) Public access, park and recreation areas in which all hunting is prohibited;

(2) Prohibited areas designated by the District Engineer in which hunting or fishing or both are prohibited;

\$10.00

(3) Prohibited areas designated by Federal or State managing agencies under applicable laws administered by such agencies.

(b) Hunting is restricted to the use of hunting devices authorized under Federal, State, and local laws and regulations \$25.00

(c) A permit shall be obtained from the District Engineer or his authorized representative to construct a duck blind on the land and/or water in any lake or reservoir area listed in 311.1 except for the Wappapello Lake Area, St. Francis River, Mo., on which duck blinds may be permitted or prohibited in accordance with regulations of the Missouri Conservation Commission relative to duck hunting. \$25.00

311.7 Camping.

(a) Camping is permitted only at areas designated by the District Engineer in charge of the lake or reservoir area or his authorized representative or the managing agency referred to in 311.1(b). \$20.00

(b) The length of stay is limited to 14 consecutive days except where the District Engineer or his authorized representative or the managing agency referred to in 311.1(b) determines a lesser stay is warranted. However, where ample facilities exist to serve the public at the time, the length of stay may be extended to no more than 30 consecutive days by special permission of the District Engineer or his authorized representative or the managing agency referred to in 311.1(b). No trailer, tent or other camping unit is permitted to remain more than 30 consecutive days. \$20.00

(c) Camping fees, where applicable, will be as posted. \$20.00

(d) Camping equipment shall not be abandoned or left unattended for 24 hours or more, and such equipment may not be placed on a camp site prior to actual occupancy. \$20.00

(e) The installation by campers of any permanent facility at any camp ground is prohibited. \$20.00

(f) Campers shall keep their camp grounds clean and dispose of combustibles and refuse in accordance with instructions posted at each camp ground by the District Engineer or his authorized representative or the managing agency referred to in 311.1(b). \$20.00

(g) Due to diligence shall be exercised in building and putting out camp fires to prevent damages to trees and vegetation and to prevent forest fires and grass fires. \$20.00

(h) Camping equipment shall be completely removed and the sites cleaned before the departure of the campers. \$20.00

(i) Quiet shall be maintained in all camping areas between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. \$20.00

311.8 Picnicking.

(a) Picnicking is permitted except in prohibited areas designated by the District Engineer or his authorized representative, or the managing agency referred to in 311.1(b). \$20.00

(b) Picnickers shall keep their picnic area clean and dispose of garbage and refuse in accordance with instructions posted by the District Engineer or his authorized representative or the managing agency referred to in 311.1(b). \$20.00

(c) Due diligence shall be exercised in building and putting out fires to prevent damages to trees and vegetation and to prevent forest and grass fires. \$20.00

311.9 Access to water areas.

(a) Pedestrian access is permitted along the shores of the lake or reservoir except in areas designated by the District Engineer or his authorized representative. \$20.00

(b) Vehicular access is permitted only over open public lake and reservoir roads. The operator of any vehicle shall obey all posted vehicular traffic control signs and devices. \$20.00

(c) Access for the general public to launch boats is permitted only at the public launching sites designated by the District Engineer. \$20.00

311.10 Destruction of public property.

The destruction, injury, defacement, or removal of public property or of vegetation, rock or minerals, except as authorized is prohibited.

311.11 Firearms, explosives, fireworks and other weapons of all kinds.

Loaded firearms, any projectile firing devices, bows and arrows, crossbows, and explosives of any kind are prohibited in the area, except when in the possession of a law enforcement officer or Government employee on official duty, when any hunting devices are being used for hunting during the hunting season as permitted under 311.6 or when specifically authorized by the District Engineer. The use of fireworks is prohibited in the area, except when authorized by the District Engineer or his authorized representative for special purposes.

311.12 Gasoline and oil storage.

Gasoline and other flammable or combustible liquids shall not be stored in, upon, or about the lake or reservoir or shores thereof without the written permission of the District Engineer or his authorized representative.

311.13 Sanitation.

Dumping and unauthorized disposal in any manner of refuse, garbage, rubbish, trash, or litter of any kind at such waters resources development projects, either into the waters of such projects or onto any land federally owned and administered by the Chief of Engineers is prohibited, except at designated points or places designed for the sanitary disposal thereof.

311.14 Advertisements.

Private notices and advertisements shall not be posted, distributed or displayed in the lake or reservoir area except such as the District Engineer or his authorized representative may deem necessary for the convenience and guidance of the public using the area for recreational purposes.

311.15 Unauthorized solicitations and business activities.

No person, firm, or corporation, or their representatives shall engage in or solicit any business on the lake or reservoir area without permission in writing from the District Engineer or in accordance with terms of a lease, license, or concession contract with the Department of the Army.

311.16 Commercial operations.

All commercial operations or activities on the waters or on the lands under the control of the Department of the Army around the lake or reservoir shall be in accordance with lease, license, or other agreements with the Department of the Army.

311.17 Recreational activity programs.

(a) Special events such as water carnivals, boat regattas, music festivals, dramatic presentations, or other special recreational programs of interest to the general public are permitted in areas designated by the District Engineer or his authorized representative.

\$25.00

(b) A permit shall be obtained from the District Engineer or his authorized representative by the governmental or legally responsible private agency proposing to hold a special event as indicated in this section. No charge will be made for this permit.

\$25.00

(c) The District Engineer in charge of the area shall have authority to revoke any permit granted under this section and to require the removal of any equipment upon failure of the permittee to comply with the terms and conditions of the permit or with the regulations in this part.

\$25.00

311.18 Abandonment of personal property.

Abandonment of personal property on the land or waters of the lake or reservoir area is prohibited. Personal property shall not be left unattended upon the lands and waters of the lake or reservoir area except in accordance with the

regulations prescribed in this part or under permits issued therefor. The Government assumes no responsibility for personal property and if such property is abandoned or left unattended in other than places designated in a permit issued therefor or under a regulation for a period in excess of 24 hours it will be impounded, and if not reclaimed by the owners it will be treated as abandoned private personal property. The District Engineer may assess a reasonable impoundment fee, which shall be paid before the impounded property may be returned to its owners.

311.19 Discriminatory practices prohibited.

All project land and water areas which are open to the public shall be available for use and enjoyment by the public without regard to race, creed, color, or national origin. No lessee or licensee of a project area under lease or license providing for a public or quasi-public use, including group camp activities, and no concessionaire of a lessee or license providing a service to the public including facilities and accommodations, shall discriminate against a person or persons because of race, creed, color, or national origin in the conduct of its operations under the lease, license or concession agreements.

311.20 Control of horses, dogs, cats and pets,

(a) Horseback riding is prohibited in developed camping, picnicking, and swimming beach areas and areas as may be designated by the District Engineer or his authorized representative or the managing agency referred to in 311.1(b).

(b) Dogs, cats, and pets are prohibited unless they are caged, penned, on a leash no longer than 6 feet, or otherwise under physical restrictive control at all times.

(c) Horses, dogs, cats, and pets are prohibited in designated beach areas.

311.21 Visiting hours.

The District Engineer or his authorized representative or the managing agency referred to in 311.1(b) may establish a reasonable schedule

of visiting hours for all or portions of the area and close or restrict the public use of all or any portion of the area, when necessary for the protection of the area or the safety and welfare of persons or property by posting of appropriate signs indicating the extent and scope of closure. All persons shall observe and abide by the officially posted signs designating closed areas and visiting hours.

311.22 Noise levels.

The operation or use of any audio or noise producing device including communication media and motorized equipment or vehicles in such a manner as to unreasonably annoy or endanger persons in any public place on the project is prohibited.

311.23 Vehicles.

The following are prohibited at developed recreation sites:

(a) Driving motor vehicles in excess of posted speeds.

(g) Excessively accelerating the engine of a motor vehicle or motorcycle when such vehicle is not moving or is approaching or leaving a stopping place.


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

I am writing to request your assistance in implementing the new regulations of the Secretary of Agriculture relating to closure of designated areas of the National Forests to off-road vehicle use. General regulations pertaining to off-road vehicle use on National Forest lands were published in the Federal Register on October 20, 1973 (38 FR 26723) and became effective such date (36 CFR 295.1-9). Subsequently, a reserve section of such regulations dealing with operating conditions was published on March 20, 1974 (39 FR 10430) and became effective such date (36 CFR 295.7).


We will appreciate your assistance in securing from the Court an order modifying the existing bail schedule order to cover these new offenses. Needless to say, it will be to the advantage of everyone concerned to begin disposing of these petty offenses in the same manner as others are now being handled without undue delay. In the meantime, the Regional Forester has written to Forest Supervisors instructing them to begin a public familiarization program prior to enforcement of the new off-road vehicle closures, but that citations may be issued where flagrant violations occur. In these instances, until a bail schedule is effective, a mandatory appearance will be shown on all citations. A copy of such memorandum bearing today's date is enclosed for your information.

Also enclosed is a copy of the bail schedule proposed by the Forest Service to cover the new regulations. As you know, Forest Service Region 5 is comprised of the four Federal Judicial Districts in California. We hope that the Judges in the Eastern District will put into effect an order for a schedule as submitted so that it will be the same throughout Forest Service Region 5. A letter similar to this is being sent today to the Chief Magistrate in the other three Judicial Districts. We see no reason to delay action on an order in your district until the others have completed action

on an order in their district. Inasmuch as citations will only be issued for flagrant violations and a mandatory appearance will be required thereon, it will be possible for each district to operate on its own by such method until the bail schedule order has been adopted. (We do not anticipate many citations so the mandatory appearances should not become an undue burden.)

Please keep us up to date as to the progress regarding this matter. If you encounter problems, please let us know. We will, of course, appreciate being advised promptly when an order covering the new regulations becomes effective. We would also appreciate receiving a copy.


SUPPLEMENT TO





Title 36—Parks, Forests, and Public Property

CHAPTER II—FOREST SERVICE, DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM Prohibitions

On October 15, 1976, a notice of proposed rulemaking was published in the FEDERAL REGISTER (41 FR 45677) for the purpose of amending or revoking current regulations on prohibited acts related to the National Forest System, and to combine all such regulations in one part of the Code of Federal Regulations, establish a uniform system for adopting and posting rules, and clarify relevant delegations of authority.

Interested persons were given until November 29, 1976, to submit written data, views or objections. All comments received were given full and careful consideration in developing final regulations. The full text of such comments are on file and available for public inspection in Room 4017, South Building, U.S. Department of Agriculture, Washington, D.C. 20250. Most comments received concerned format, style of expression, grammatical preferences, and clarification. More substantive comments received and results of their consideration are summarized as follows:

Comment: The regulations are excessive and unduly harass the general public; permits for non-commercial purposes should not be required; the regulations should be modified to include only specific reference to specific real problems; Federal employees should be penalized for undue interference with members of the general public; proper posting should be mandatory; and a review board should be established to hear complaints by members of the public.

Response: The general tenor of the comments is at cross purposes with the basic reason for the regulations, i.e., the protection first of the public and the next of the lands within the National Forest System for the long-range benefit of the general public; further, that such lands are to be managed in accord with the Multiple Use-Sustained Yield, Resources Planning, National Environmental Policy, Wilderness, National Forest Management, and related Acts. A number of changes have been made to simplify these rules, and to make more specific reference to the specific real problems covered.

Comment: More specific details on prohibited acts should be contained in the Forest Service Manual, and present regulations should not be reissued.

Response: The policy of the Department to follow the rulemaking requirements of the Administrative Procedures Act requires that changes and additions be published in the FEDERAL REGISTER. Certain changes are necessary due to changing delegations of authority, and matters not covered by existing regulations.

Comment: Some prohibitions are in conflict with rights being exercised by persons engaged in authorized activities within the National Forest System, particularly livestock and timber operations.

Response: The matters cited as in potential conflict chiefly concern prohibitions which may be applied under Subpart B, Paragraph (e) of § 261.50 provides for exemptions which recognize most of these practices. The language in § 261.10 is revised to the extent practicable.

Comment: Posting of Subpart E Orders should include both placing a copy in the Offices of the District Ranger and Forest Supervisor and displaying the order so as to reasonably bring it to the attention of the public.

Response: Section 261.51 is revised to require this procedure.

Comment: Section 261.3 is not clear and contains factors which are too subjective.

Response: This section is revised to clarify its meaning and to reduce the possible need for subjective criteria.

Comment: Section 261.10 should include language to cover private personal property lawfully being used on National Forest System lands.

Response: The statutes under which these regulations are issued do not contain authority to cover such property.

Comment: Off-road vehicles should be prohibited except for scientific research, emergencies, or in designated areas with an approved EIS within the National Forest System until studies, which the Department should undertake, have been completed to determine the effect of noise on wildlife.

Response: In view of the limited evidence that noise may have an adverse effect, and the effect such a decision would have on an entire class of recreation users, it is decided not to incorporate this change which can be made later if determined to be warranted.

Comment: Requirements for motorcycle and snowmobile operators are not accurately reflected in § 261.14.

Response: This section, now § 261.13, is revised in accord with the suggestions made.

Comment: Possible prohibitions on forest development and scenic trails should include travel by skis, snowshoes or any other means, as additions to § 261.56.

Response: This section is rewritten as § 261.18 and § 261.55. This change covers the idea in the comment.

A separate rulemaking document, being published concurrently, makes the change in 7 CFR 2.60(b)(1) as proposed. A technical change has been made in 36 CFR 261.70 to reflect the revised delegations of authority. In a separate notice being published concurrently, the Chief, Forest Service, has delegated authority to issue § 261.70 regulations to each Regional Forester.

Other than reflected above, there are no changes of substance.

These actions were taken pursuant to the requirements of the Administrative Procedures Act (5 U.S.C. 553), adopted by this Department as a matter of policy on July 24, 1971 (36 FR 13804).

As a result of this process the following changes are made:

Subpart A—General Prohibitions

§ 261.1 Scope.

The prohibitions in this part apply, except as otherwise provided, when:

(a) An act or omission occurs in the National Forest System or on a Forest development road or trail.

(b) An act or omission affects, threatens, or endangers property of the United States administered by the Forest Service.

(c) An act or omission affects, threatens, or endangers a person using, or engaged in the protection, improvement or administration of the National Forest System or a Forest development road or trail.

§ 261.2 Definitions.

The following definitions apply to this part:

(a) "Campfire" means a fire, not within any building, mobile home or living accommodation mounted on a motor

vehicle, which is used for cooking, personal warmth, lighting, ceremonial, or esthetic purposes. "Fire" includes campfire.

(b) "Camping" means the temporary use of National Forest System lands for the purpose of overnight occupancy without a permanently-fixed structure.

(c) "Camping equipment" means the personal property used in or suitable for camping, and includes any vehicle used for transport and all personal property in possession of a person camping.

(d) "Developed recreation site" means an area which has been improved or developed for recreation.

(e) "Forest development road" means a road wholly or partly within or adjacent to and serving a part of the National Forest System and which has been included in the Forest Development Road System Plan.

(f) "Forest development trail" means a trail wholly or partly within or adjacent to and serving a part of the National Forest System and which has been included in the Forest Development Trail System Plan.

(g) "Forest officer" means an employee of the Forest Service.

(h) "National Forest System" includes all national forest lands and waters reserved or withdrawn from the public domain of the United States, national forest lands and waters acquired through purchase, exchange, donation, or other means, national grasslands and land utilization projects and waters administered under Title III of the Bankhead-Jones Farm Tenant Act (50 Stat. 525, 7 U.S.C. 1010-1012), and other lands, waters, or interests therein acquired under the Wild and Scenic River Act (16 U.S.C. 1271-1287) or National Trails System Act (16 U.S.C. 1241-1249).

(i) "National Forest wilderness" means those parts of the National Forest System which were designated units of the National Wilderness Preservation System by the Wilderness Act of September 3, 1964, and such other areas of the National Forest System as are added to the wilderness system by act of Congress.

(j) "Person" means natural person, corporation, company, partnership, trust, firm, or association of persons.

(k) "Permission" means oral authorization by a forest officer.

(l) "Permit" means authorization in writing by a forest officer.

(m) "Primitive Areas" are those areas within the National Forest System classified as "Primitive" on the effective date of the Wilderness Act, September 3, 1964.

(n) "Publicly nude" means nude in any place where a person may be observed by another person. Any person is nude if the person has failed to cover the rectal area, pubic area or genitals. A female person is also nude if she has failed to cover both breasts below a point immediately above the top of the areola. Each such covering must be fully opaque. No person under the age of 10 years shall be considered publicly nude.

(o) "State" means any State, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, and the District of Columbia.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

(p) "State law" means the law of any State in whose exterior boundaries an act or omission occurs regardless of whether State law is otherwise applicable.

(q) "Stove fire" means a campfire built inside an enclosed stove or grill, a portable brazier, or a pressurized liquid or gas stove, including a space-heating device.

(r) "Unauthorized livestock" means any cattle, sheep, goat, hog, or equine not defined as a wild free-roaming horse or burro, by § 231.11(a)(2), which is not authorized by permit to be upon the land on which the livestock is located and which is not related to use authorized by a grazing permit.

§ 261.3 Interfering with forest officers prohibited.

Threatening, resisting, intimidating, or interfering with any forest officer engaged in or on account of the performance of his official duties in the protection, improvement, or administration of the National Forest System is prohibited.

§ 261.4 Disorderly conduct.

The following are prohibited:

- (a) Engaging in fighting, or in threatening or abusive behavior.
- (b) Inciting or participating in a riot.
- (c) Making unreasonable noise.

§ 261.5 Fire.

The following are prohibited:

- (a) Carelessly or negligently throwing or placing any burning, glowing, or ignited substance, or any other substance or thing which may cause a fire, into any place where it might start a fire.
- (b) Firing any tracer bullet or incendiary ammunition.
- (c) Causing timber, trees, slash, brush or grass to burn except as authorized by permit.
- (d) Leaving a fire without completely extinguishing it.
- (e) Allowing a fire to escape from control.

(f) Building, attending, maintaining, or using a campfire without removing all flammable material from around the campfire adequate to prevent its escape.

§ 261.6 Timber and other forest products.

The following are prohibited:

- (a) Cutting, killing, destroying, girdling, chipping, chopping, boxing, injuring, or otherwise damaging, or removing, any timber, tree or other forest product, except as authorized by permit, timber sale contract, Federal law or regulation.
- (b) Cutting any standing tree, under permit or timber sale contract, before a Forest Officer has marked it or has otherwise designated it for cutting.
- (c) Removing any timber or other forest product cut under permit or timber sale contract, except to a place designated for scaling, or removing it from that place before it is scaled, measured, counted, or otherwise accounted for by a forest officer.
- (d) Stamping, marking with paint, or otherwise identifying any tree or other

forest product in a manner similar to that employed by forest officers to mark or designate tree or any other forest product for cutting or removal.

(e) Loading, removing or hauling any timber or other forest product acquired under any permit or timber sale contract unless such product is identified as required in such permit or contract.

(f) Selling or exchanging timber or other forest product obtained under free use pursuant to §§ 221.26, 221.27, or 221.28.

(g) Violating any timber export or substitution restriction in § 221.25.

§ 261.7 Livestock.

The following are prohibited:

(a) Placing or allowing unauthorized livestock to enter or be in the National Forest System.

(b) Not removing unauthorized livestock from the National Forest System when requested by a forest officer.

(c) Failing to reclose any gate or other entry.

(d) Molesting, injuring, removing or releasing any livestock impounded under § 262.2 while in the custody of the Forest Service or its authorized agents.

(e) Removing or attempting to remove, converting to use, causing the death of, harassing or interfering with any wild, free-roaming horse or burro defined in § 231.11(a)(2), or selling or commercially processing any part or carcass thereof.

§ 261.8 Fish and wildlife.

The following are prohibited within the boundaries of a national game refuge or preserve or wildlife preserve in the National Forest System and are also prohibited in other parts of the National Forest System to the extent Federal or State law is violated:

- (a) Hunting, trapping, fishing, catching, molesting, killing or having in possession any kind of wild animal, bird, or fish, or taking the eggs of any such bird.
- (b) Possessing a firearm or other implement designed to discharge a missile capable of destroying animal life.
- (c) Possessing equipment which could be used for hunting, fishing, or trapping.
- (d) Possessing a dog not on a leash or otherwise confined.

§ 261.9 Property.

The following are prohibited:

- (a) Mutilating, defacing, removing, disturbing, injuring or destroying any natural feature or any property of the United States.
- (b) Removing, destroying or damaging any plant that is classified as a threatened, endangered, rare or unique species.
- (c) Entering any building or structure owned or controlled by the United States when such building or structure is not open to the public.
- (d) Using any herbicide, pesticide or fungicide except for personal use for medical purposes or as an insect repellent or with permission for other minor uses.
- (e) Digging in, excavating, disturbing, injuring, or destroying any archeologi-

cal, paleontological, or historic site, or removing, disturbing, injuring, or destroying an object in such a site.

§ 261.10 Occupancy and use.

The following are prohibited:

(a) Constructing, placing, or maintaining any kind of road, trail, structure, fence, enclosure, communication equipment, or other improvement without a permit.

(b) Taking possession of, occupying, or otherwise using National Forest System lands for residential purposes without a permit or as otherwise authorized by Federal law or regulation.

(c) Selling or offering for sale any merchandise unless authorized by Federal law, regulation or permit.

(d) Discharging a firearm or any other implement capable of taking human life, causing injury, or damaging property:

- (1) In or within 150 yards of a residence, building, campsite, developed recreation site or occupied area, or
- (2) across or on a Forest Development road or a body of water adjacent thereto whereby any person or property is exposed to injury or damage as a result of such discharge.

(e) Abandoning a vehicle, animal, or personal property.

(f) Placing a vehicle or other object in such a manner that it is an impediment or hazard to the safety or convenience of any person.

(g) Posting, placing, or erecting any paper, notice, advertising material, sign, or similar matter without a permit.

(h) Operating or using in or near a campsite, developed recreation site, or over an adjacent body of water without a permit, any device which produces noise, such as a radio, television, musical instrument, motor or engine in such a manner and at such a time so as to unreasonably disturb any person.

(i) Operating or using a public address system, whether fixed, portable, or vehicle mounted, in or near a campsite, developed recreation site, or over an adjacent body of water without a permit.

(j) Conducting, demonstrating, or participating in a public meeting, assembly, or special event, except as authorized by permit.

§ 261.11 Sanitation.

The following are prohibited:

(a) Depositing in any toilet, toilet vault, or plumbing fixture, any bottle, can, cloth, rag, metal, wood, stone, flammable liquid, or other substance which could damage or interfere with the operation or maintenance of the fixture.

(b) Possessing or leaving refuse, debris, or litter in an exposed or unsanitary condition.

(c) Placing in or near a stream, lake, or other water any substance which does or may pollute a stream, lake, or other water.

(d) Failing to dispose of all garbage, including any paper, can, bottle, sewage, waste water or material, or rubbish either by removal from the site or area, or by depositing it into receptacles or at places provided for such purposes.

(e) Dumping or leaving in a refuse container, dump, or similar facility, refuse, debris, or litter brought as such from private property or from land occupied under permit.

§ 261.12 Forest development roads and trails.

The following are prohibited:

(a) Violating the load, weight, height, length or width limitations prescribed by State law, except by permit, written agreement, or where greater or lesser limits have been established pursuant to § 261.54.

(b) Failing to have a vehicle weighed at a Forest Service weighing station, if required by a sign.

(c) Failing to stop a vehicle when directed to do so by a forest officer.

(d) Damaging and leaving in a damaged condition any such road, trail, or segment thereof.

(e) Blocking, restricting, or otherwise interfering with the use of a road, trail, or gate.

(f) Using motorized vehicles in excess of 40 inches in width on a trail.

§ 261.13 Use of vehicles off roads.

It is prohibited to operate any vehicle off Forest Development, State or County roads:

(a) Without a valid license as required by State law.

(b) Without an operable braking system.

(c) From one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise unless equipped with working head and tail lights.

(d) In violation of any applicable noise emission standard established by any Federal or State agency.

(e) While under the influence of alcohol or other drug;

(f) Creating excessive or unusual smoke;

(g) Carelessly, recklessly, or without regard for the safety of any person, or in a manner that endangers, or is likely to endanger, any person or property.

§ 261.14 Developed recreation sites.

The following are prohibited:

(a) Occupying any portion of the site for other than recreation purposes.

(b) Building, attending, maintaining, or using a fire outside of a fire ring provided by the Forest Service for such purpose or outside of a stove, grill or fireplace.

(c) Cleaning or washing any personal property, fish, animal, or food at a hydrant or at a water faucet not provided for that purpose.

(d) Discharging or igniting a firecracker, rocket or other firework, or explosive.

(e) Occupying between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. a place designated for day use only.

(f) Failing to remove all camping equipment or personal property when vacating the area or site.

(g) Placing, maintaining, or using camping equipment except in a place specifically designated or provided for such equipment.

(h) Without permission, failing to have at least one person occupy a camping area during the first night after camping equipment has been set up.

(i) Leaving camping equipment unattended for more than 24 hours without permission.

(j) Bringing in or possessing an animal, other than a seeing eye dog, unless it is crated, caged, or upon a leash not longer than six feet, or otherwise under physical restrictive control.

(k) Bringing in or possessing in a swimming area an animal, other than a seeing eye dog.

(l) Bringing in or possessing a saddle, pack, or draft animal, except as authorized by a sign.

(m) Operating or parking a motor vehicle or trailer except in places developed for this purpose.

(n) Operating a bicycle, motorbike, or motorcycle on a trail unless designated for this use.

(o) Operating a motorbike, motorcycle, or other motor vehicle for any purpose other than entering or leaving the site.

(p) Distributing any handbill, circular, paper, or notice without a permit.

(q) Depositing any body waste except into receptacles provided for that purpose.

§ 261.15 Admission, recreation use and special recreation permit fees.

Failing to pay any fee established for admission or entrance to, or use of a site, facility, equipment, or service within the National Forest System furnished by the United States is prohibited. The statutory maximum for a violation of this section is a fine of not more than \$100.00. (Sec. 2, 78 Stat. 897, as amended; 16 USC 4601-6(c))

§ 261.16 National Forest wilderness.

The following are prohibited in a National Forest wilderness:

(a) Possessing or using a motor or motorized equipment except small battery-powered, hand-held devices, such as cameras, shavers, flashlights and Geiger counters.

(b) Possessing or using a hang glider or bicycle.

(c) Landing of aircraft, or the dropping or picking up of any material, supplies, or person from aircraft, except by permit or as specifically authorized by Federal law or regulation.

§ 261.17 Boundary Waters Canoe Area, Superior National Forest.

The following are prohibited in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area:

(a) Possessing or transporting any motor or other mechanical device capable of propelling a watercraft through water by any means, except by permit or as specifically authorized by Federal law or regulation.

(b) Transporting, using, or mooring amphibious craft or any type or any watercraft designed for or used as floating living quarters.

(c) Using wheels, rollers, or other mechanical devices for the overland trans-

portation of any watercraft, except by permit or as specifically authorized by Federal law or regulation.

§ 261.18 Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail.

It is prohibited to use a motorized vehicle on the Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail without a permit.

§ 261.19 National Forest primitive areas.

It is prohibited in a National Forest primitive area to violate any prohibition in § 293.17 of this title.

§ 261.20 Unauthorized use of "Smokey Bear" and "Woodsy Owl" symbol.

(a) Manufacture, importation, reproduction or use of "Smokey Bear" except as provided under §§ 261.2, 271.3, or 271.4 is prohibited.

(b) Manufacture, importation, reproduction, or use of "Woodsy Owl" except as provided under §§ 262.2, 272.3, or 272.4 is prohibited.

Subpart B—Prohibitions in Areas Designated by Order

§ 261.50 Orders.

(a) The Chief, each Regional Forester, each Experiment Station Director, the Administrator of the Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit and each Forest Supervisor may issue orders which close or restrict the use of described areas within the area over which he has jurisdiction. An order may close an area to entry or may restrict the use of an area by applying any or all of the prohibitions authorized in this subpart or any portion thereof.

(b) The Chief, each Regional Forester, each Experiment Station Director, the Administrator of the Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit and each Forest Supervisor may issue orders which close or restrict the use of any forest development road or trail.

(c) Each order shall:

(1) For orders issued under paragraph (a) of this section, describe the area to which the order applies;

(2) For orders issued under paragraph (b) of this section, describe the road or trail to which the order applies;

(3) Specify the times during which the prohibitions apply if applied only during limited times;

(4) State each prohibition which is applied;

(5) Be posted in accordance with § 261.51.

(d) The prohibitions which are applied by an order are supplemental to the general prohibitions in Subpart A.

(e) An order may exempt any of the following persons from any of the prohibitions contained in the order:

(1) Persons with a permit authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission. The issuing officer may include in any permit such conditions as he considers necessary for the protection or administration of the road, trail, or National Forest System or for the promotion of the health, safety, or welfare of its users;

(2) Owners or lessees of land in the area;

(3) Residents in the area;

(4) Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty; and

(5) Persons engaged in a business, trade, or occupation in the area.

(f) It is prohibited to violate the terms or conditions of a permit issued under (c) (1) of this section.

(g) Any person wishing to use a Forest development road or trail or a portion of the National Forest System, should contact the Forest Supervisor, District Administrator, or District Ranger to ascertain the special restrictions which may be applicable thereto.

§ 261.51 Posting.

Posting is accomplished by:

(a) Placing a copy of the order imposing each prohibition in the offices of the Forest Supervisor and District Ranger, or equivalent officer who have jurisdiction over the lands affected by the order, and

(b) Displaying each prohibition imposed by an order in such locations and manner as to reasonably bring the prohibition to the attention of the public.

§ 261.52 Fire.

When provided by an order, the following are prohibited:

(a) Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire.

(b) Using an explosive.

(c) Smoking.

(d) Smoking, except inside a building or vehicle, or while seated in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable materials.

(e) Going into or being upon an area.

(f) Possessing, discharging or using any kind of firework or other pyrotechnic device.

(g) Entering an area without any firefighting tool prescribed by the order.

(h) Operating an internal combustion engine except on a road.

(i) Welding, or operating acetylene or other torch with open flame.

(j) Operating or using any internal or external combustion engine on any timber, brush, or grass covered land, including trails traversing such land, without a spark arrester, maintained in effective working order, meeting either (i) Department of Agriculture, Forest Service Standard 5100-1a; or (ii) the 80 percent efficiency level determined according to the appropriate Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE) recommended Practices J335 and J350.

(k) Violating any state law specified in the order concerning burning, fires or which is for the purpose of preventing, or restricting the spread of, fires.

§ 261.53 Special closures.

When provided in an order, it is prohibited to go into or be upon any area which is closed for the protection of:

(a) Threatened, endangered, rare, unique, or vanishing species of plants, animals, birds or fish.

(b) Special biological communities.

(c) Objects or areas of historical, archaeological, geological, or paleontological interest.

(d) Scientific experiments or investigations.

(e) Public health or safety.

(f) Property.

§ 261.54 Forest development roads.

When provided by an order, the following are prohibited:

(a) Using any type of vehicle prohibited by the order.

(b) Use by any type of traffic prohibited by the order.

(c) Using a road for commercial hauling without a permit or written authorization.

(d) Operating a vehicle in violation of the speed, load, weight, height, length, width, or other limitations specified by the order.

(e) Being on the road.

§ 261.55 Forest development trails.

When provided by an order, the following are prohibited:

(a) Being on the trail.

(b) Using a bicycle or motorized vehicle.

(c) Possessing or using a saddle, pack, or draft animal.

(d) Shortcutting a switchback.

§ 261.56 Use of vehicles off forest development roads.

When provided by an order, it is prohibited to possess or use a vehicle off forest development roads.

§ 261.57 National Forest wilderness.

When provided by an order, the following are prohibited:

(a) Entering or being in the area.

(b) Possessing camping or pack-out-fitting equipment, as specified in the order.

(c) Possessing a firearm or firework.

(d) Possessing any non-burnable food or beverage containers, including deposit bottles, except for non-burnable containers designed and intended for repeated use.

(e) Grazing.

(f) Storing equipment, personal property or supplies.

(g) Disposing of debris, garbage, or other waste.

§ 261.58 Occupancy and use.

When provided by an order, the following are prohibited:

(a) Camping for a period longer than allowed by the order.

(b) Entering or using a developed recreation site or portion thereof.

(c) Entering or remaining in a campground during night periods prescribed in the order except for persons who are occupying such campgrounds.

(d) Occupying a developed recreation site with prohibited camping equipment prescribed by the order.

(e) Camping.

(f) Using a campsite or other area described in the order by more than the number of users allowed by the order.

(g) Parking or leaving a vehicle in violation of a posted sign.

(h) Parking or leaving a vehicle outside a parking space assigned to one's own camp unit.

(i) Possessing, parking or leaving more than two vehicles, except motorcycles or bicycles, per camp unit.

(j) Being publicly nude.

(k) Entering or being in a body of water.

(l) Being in the area after sundown or before sunrise.

(m) Discharging a firearm, air rifle, or gas gun.

(n) Possessing or operating a motorboat.

(o) Water skiing.

(p) Storing or leaving a boat or raft.

(q) Operating any watercraft in excess of a posted speed limit.

(r) Launching a boat except at a designated launching ramp.

(s) Possessing or transporting a bird or animal.

(t) Possessing or transporting any part of a tree or plant.

(u) Being in the area between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. except a person who is camping or who is visiting a person camping in that area.

(v) Hunting or fishing.

Subpart C—Prohibitions in Regions

§ 261.70 Issuance of regulations.

(a) Pursuant to 7 CFR 2.60, the Chief, and each Regional Forester, to whom the Chief has delegated authority, may issue regulations prohibiting acts or omissions within all or any part of the area over which he has jurisdiction, for one or more of the following purposes:

(1) Fire prevention or control.

(2) Disease prevention or control.

(3) Protection of property, roads or trails.

(4) Protection of threatened, endangered, rare, unique, or vanishing species of plants, animals, birds or fish, or special biological communities.

(5) Protection of objects or places of historical, archaeological, geological or paleontological interest.

(6) Protection of scientific experiments or investigations.

(7) Public safety.

(8) Protection of health.

(9) Establishing reasonable rules of public conduct.

(b) Regulations issued under this subpart shall not be contrary to or duplicate any prohibition which is established under existing regulations.

(c) In issuing any regulations under paragraph (a) of this section, the issuing officer shall follow 5 U.S.C. 553.

(d) In a situation when the issuing officer determines that a notice of proposed rule making and public participation thereon is impracticable, unnecessary, or contrary to the public interest, he shall issue, with the concurrence of the Chief, an interim regulation containing an expiration date.

(e) No interim regulation issued under paragraph (d) of this section will be effective for more than 90 days unless re-

adopted as a permanent rule after a notice of proposed rule making under 5 USC 553 (b) and (c).

§ 262.1 Rewards in connection with fire or property prosecutions.

(a) Hereafter, provided Congress shall make the necessary appropriation or authorize the payment thereof, the Department of Agriculture will pay the following rewards:

(1) Not exceeding \$1,000 and not less than \$100 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of any person on the charge of willfully or maliciously setting on fire, or causing to be set on fire, any timber, underbrush, or grass upon the lands of the United States within the National Forest System or nearby:

(2) Not exceeding \$300 and not less than \$50 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of any person on the charge of building or causing a fire on lands of the United States within the National Forest System or nearby, and leaving said fire which escapes before the same has been totally extinguished;

(3) Not exceeding \$1,000 and not less than \$50 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of any person charged with destroying or stealing any property of the United States.

(4) A reward may be paid to the person or persons giving the information leading to such arrest and conviction upon presentation to the Department of Agriculture of satisfactory evidence thereof, subject to the necessary appropriation as aforesaid, or otherwise as may be provided.

(c) Officers and employees of the Department of Agriculture are barred from receiving such rewards.

(d) The Department of Agriculture reserves the right to refuse payments of any claim for reward when, in its opinion, collusion or improper methods have been used to secure arrest and conviction. The Department also reserves the right to allow only one reward where several persons have been convicted of the same offense or where one person has been convicted of several offenses, unless the circumstances entitle the person to a reward on each conviction.

(e) Applications for reward should be forwarded to the Regional Forester, Research Director, or Area Director who has responsibility for the land or property involved in the trespass. However, no application will be considered unless presented to a responsible Forest Service officer within three months from the date of conviction of an offender. In order that all claimants for rewards may have an opportunity to present their claims within the prescribed limit, the Department will not take action with respect to rewards for three months from the date of the conviction of an offender. (58 Stat. 736; 16 U.S.C. 559a.)

§ 262.2 Impoundment and disposal of unauthorized livestock.

Unauthorized livestock or livestock in excess of those authorized by a grazing permit on the National Forest System, which are not removed therefrom within the periods prescribed by this regulation, may be impounded and disposed of by a forest officer as provided herein.

(a) When a Forest officer determines that such livestock use is occurring, has definite knowledge of the kind of livestock, and knows the name and address of the owners, such livestock may be impounded any time five days after written notice of intent to impound such livestock is mailed by certified or registered mail or personally delivered to such owners.

(b) When a Forest officer determines that such livestock use is occurring, but does not have complete knowledge of the kind of livestock, or if the name of the owner is unknown, such livestock may be impounded any time 15 days after the date a notice of intent to impound livestock is first published in a local newspaper and posted at the county courthouse and in one or more local post offices. The notice will identify the area in which it will be effective.

(c) Unauthorized livestock or livestock in excess of those authorized by a grazing permit on National Forest System which are owned by persons given notice under paragraph (a) of this section, and any such livestock in areas for which a notice has been posted and published under paragraph (b) of this section, may

be impounded without further notice any time within the 12-month period immediately following the effective date of the notice or notices given under paragraphs (a) and (b) of this section.

(d) Following the impoundment of livestock, a notice of sale of impounded livestock will be published in a local newspaper and posted at the county courthouse and in one or more local post offices. The notice will describe the livestock and specify the date, time, and place of the sale. The date shall be at least five days after the publication and posting of such notice.

(e) The owner may redeem the livestock any time before the date and time set for the sale by submitting proof of ownership and paying for all expenses incurred by the United States in gathering, impounding, and feeding or pasturing the livestock. However, when the impoundment costs exceed fair market value a minimum acceptable redemption price at fair market value may be established for each head of livestock.

(f) If the livestock are not redeemed on or before the date and time fixed for their sale, they shall be sold at public sale to the highest bidder, providing this bid is at or above the minimum amount set by the Forest Service. If a bid at or above the minimum amount is not received, the livestock may be sold at private sale at or above the minimum amount, reoffered at public sale, condemned and destroyed, or otherwise disposed of. When livestock are sold pursuant to this regulation, the forest officer making the sale shall furnish the purchaser a bill or other written instrument evidencing the sale. Agreements may be made with State agencies whereby unbranded livestock of unknown ownership are released to the agency for disposition in accordance with State law.

§ 262.3 Impounding of dogs.

Any dog found running at large in a part of the National Forest System, which has been closed to dogs running at large, may be captured and impounded by Forest officers. Forest officers will notify the owner of the dog, if known, of such impounding, and the owner will be given five days to redeem the dog. A dog may be redeemed by the owner submitting adequate evidence of ownership and paying all expenses incurred by the Forest Service in capturing and impounding it. If the owner fails to redeem the dog within five days after notice, or if the owner cannot be ascertained within 10 days from the date of impounding, the dog may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of at the discretion of the Forest officer having possession of it.

§ 262.4 Impounding of personal property.

(a) Automobiles or other vehicles, trailers, boats, and camping equipment and other inanimate personal property on National Forest System lands without the authorization of a Forest officer which are not removed therefrom within the prescribed period after a warning notice as provided in this regulation may

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be impounded by a Forest officer. Whenever such Forest officer knows the name and address of the owner, such impoundment may be effected at any time five days after the date that written notice of the trespass is mailed by registered mail or delivered to such owner.

(b) In the event the local Forest officer does not know the name and address of the owner, impoundment may be effected at any time 15 days after the date a notice of intention to impound the property in trespass is first published in a local newspaper and posted at the county courthouse and in one or more local post offices. A copy of this notice shall also be posted in at least one place on the property or in proximity thereto.

(c) Personal property impounded under this regulation may be disposed of at the expiration of 90-days after the date of impoundment. The owner may redeem the personal property within the 90-day period by submitting proof of ownership and paying all expenses incurred by the United States in advertising, gathering, moving, impounding, storing, and otherwise caring for the property, and also for the value of the use of the site occupied during the period of the trespass.

(d) If the personal property is not redeemed on or before the date fixed for its disposition, it shall be sold by the Forest Service at public sale to the highest bidder. If no bid is received, the property, or portions thereof, may, in the discretion of the responsible Forest officer, be sold at private sale or be condemned and destroyed or otherwise disposed of. When personal property is sold pursuant to this regulation, the Forest officer making the sale shall furnish the purchaser a bill of sale or other written instrument evidencing the sale.

§ 262.5 Removal of obstructions.

A Forest officer may remove or cause to be removed, to a more suitable place, a vehicle or other object which is an impediment or hazard to the safety, convenience, or comfort of other users of an area of the National Forest System.

CHAPTER II—COPYRIGHT OFFICE, LIBRARY OF CONGRESS

[Docket RM 76-1; Rules Doc. A]

PART 201—GENERAL PROVISIONS

Use of Copyright Office Records for Compiling Mailing Lists and Similar Purposes; Miscellaneous Technical Amendments

On November 15, 1976, proposals were published in the FEDERAL REGISTER regarding (1) the addition of a new regulation § 201.9 governing the filing of agreements between copyright owners and public broadcasting entities; (2) the addition of a new regulation § 201.10 pertaining to the termination of transfers and licenses covering the renewal term of copyright as extended by Pub. L. 94-553 (90 Stat. 2541); (3) an amendment of § 201.2(b) of the existing Copyright Office regulations to delete the prohibition on the use of Office records for compiling mailing lists and the like; and (4) technical corrective amendments to other Copyright Office regulations. Interested persons were given until December 15, 1976 to submit comments. 41 FR 50300, corrected in part at 41 FR 51428.

Comments received in response to the proposals regarding the filing of agreements between copyright owners and public broadcasting entities and the termination of transfers covering the extended renewal term are now being considered by the Copyright Office; these proposals and the comments received in response thereto are not the subject of this rules document.

The proposed amendment to § 201.2(b) of the regulations is to delete paragraph (2) of that section, which prohibits the "copying from the Copyright Office records of names and addresses for the purpose of compiling mailing lists and other similar uses." The Copyright Office had concluded that this prohibition is an unwarranted limitation on the public use of Office records. One comment was received in support of the proposed deletion; no comments were received in opposition.

The technical amendments were proposed to correct ZIP Code references in §§ 201.1 and 201.2(c)(2)(ii); to delete an out-dated reference to "Copyright Office Form C-85" and correct the CFR citation in § 201.8; and to identify Part 14 of the Catalog of Copyright Entries in § 201.3. No comments were received with respect to these proposed amendments.

In consideration of the foregoing, the proposed amendment to § 201.2(b) to delete the prohibition on the use of Office records for mailing lists and like uses and the proposed technical amendments to §§ 201.1, 201.2(c)(2)(ii), 201.3 and 201.8 are hereby adopted without change and are set forth below.

Effective date: As the amendment relating to the use of Office records is intended to relieve a restriction and as the technical amendments are to conform the regulations to existing facts, they shall become effective on January 14, 1977.

40 (f) Selling or exchanging timber or other forest product obtained under free use pursuant to § 221.26, § 221.27, or § 221.28.

40 (g) Violating any timber export or substitution restriction in § 221.25.

§ 261.7 Livestock.

The following are prohibited:

40 (a) Placing or allowing unauthorized livestock to enter or be in the National Forest System.

40 (b) Not removing unauthorized livestock from the National Forest System when requested by a forest officer.

25 (c) Failing to reclose any gate or other entry.

Mandatory (d) Molesting, injuring, removing or releasing any livestock appearance impounded under § 262.2 while in the custody of the Forest Service or its authorized agents.

Mandatory (e) Removing or attempting to remove, converting to use, appearance causing the death of, harrassing or interfering with any wild, free-roaming horse or burro defined in § 231.11(a)(2), or selling or commercially processing any part or carcass thereof.

§ 261.8 Fish and wildlife.

The following are prohibited within the boundaries of a national game refuge or preserve or wildlife preserve in the National Forest System and are also prohibited in other parts of the National Forest System to the extent Federal or State law is violated:

40 (a) Hunting, trapping, fishing, catching, molesting, killing or having in possession any kind of wild animal, bird, or fish, or taking the eggs of any such bird.

40 (b) Possessing a firearm or other implement designed to discharge a missile capable of destroying animal life.

40 (c) Possessing equipment which could be used for hunting, fishing, or trapping.

25 (d) Possessing a dog not on a leash or otherwise confined.

§ 261.9 Property.

The following are prohibited:

40 (a) Mutilating, defacing, removing, disturbing, injuring or destroying any natural feature or any property of the United States.

40 (b) Removing, destroying or damaging any plant that is classified as a threatened, endangered, rare or unique species.

Mandatory appearance (c) Entering any building or structure owned or controlled by the United States when such building or structure is not open to the public.

35 (d) Using any herbicide, pesticide or fungicide except for personal use for medical purposes or as an insect repellant or with permission for other minor uses.

Mandatory appearance (e) Digging in, excavating, disturbing, injuring, or destroying any archeological, paleontological, or historic site, or removing, disturbing, injuring, or destroying an object in such a site.

§ 261.10 Occupancy and use.

The following are prohibited:

35 (a) Constructing, placing, or maintaining any kind of road,

trail, structure, fence, enclosure, communication equipment, or other improvement without a permit.

**Mandatory
appearance**

(b) Taking possession of, occupying, or otherwise using National Forest System lands for residential purposes without a permit or as otherwise authorized by Federal law or regulation.

25 (c) Selling or offering for sale any merchandise unless authorized by Federal law, regulation or permit.

50 (d) Discharging a firearm or any other implement capable of taking human life, causing injury, or damaging property:
(1) in or within 150 yards of a residence, building, campsite, developed recreation site or occupied area, or (2) across or on a Forest Development road or a body of water adjacent thereto whereby any person or property is exposed to injury or damage as a result of such discharge.

25 (e) Abandoning a vehicle, animal, or personal property.

25 (f) Placing a vehicle or other object in such a manner that it is an impediment or hazard to the safety or convenience of any person.

25 (g) Posting, placing, or erecting any paper, notice, advertising material, sign, or similar matter without a permit.

25 (h) Operating or using in or near a campsite, developed recreation site, or over an adjacent body of water without a permit, any device which produces noise, such as a radio, television, musical instrument, motor or engine in such a manner and at such a time so as to unreasonably disturb any person.

25 (d) Operating or using a public address system, whether fixed, portable, or vehicle mounted, in or near a campsite, developed recreation site, or over an adjacent body of water without a permit.

25 (e) Conducting, demonstrating, or participating in a public meeting, assembly, or special event, except as authorized by permit.

§ 261.11 Sanitation.

The following are prohibited:

40 (a) Depositing in any toilet, toilet vault, or plumbing fixture, any bottle, can, cloth, rag, metal, wood, stone, flammable liquid, or other substance which could damage or interfere with the operation or maintenance of the fixture.

25 (b) Possessing or leaving refuse, debris, or litter in an exposed or unsanitary condition.

40 (c) Placing in or near a stream, lake, or other water any substance which does or may pollute a stream, lake, or other water.

25 (d) Failing to dispose of all garbage, including any paper, can, bottle, sewage, waste water or material, or rubbish either by removal from the site or area, or by depositing it into receptacles or at places provided for such purposes.

25 (e) Dumping or leaving in a refuse container, dump, or similar facility, refuse, debris, or litter brought as such from private property or from land occupied under permit.

§ 261.12 Forest development roads and trails.

The following are prohibited:

- 50 (a) Violating the load, weight, height, length or width limitations prescribed by State law, except by permit, written agreement, or where greater or lesser limits have been established pursuant to § 261.54.
- 40 (b) Failing to have a vehicle weighed at a Forest Service weighing station, if required by a sign.
- 40 (c) Failing to stop a vehicle when directed to do so by a forest officer.
- 40 (d) Damaging and leaving in a damaged condition any such road, trail, or segment thereof.
- 25 (e) Blocking, restricting, or otherwise interfering with the use of a road, trail, or gate.
- 25 (f) Using motorized vehicles in excess of 40 inches in width on a trail.

§ 261.13 Use of vehicles off roads.

It is prohibited to operate any vehicle off Forest Development, State or County roads:

- 25 (a) Without a valid license as required by State law.
 - 25 (b) Without an operable braking system.
 - 25 (c) From one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise unless equipped with working head and tail lights.
 - 25 (d) In violation of any applicable noise emission standard established by any Federal or State agency.
- 4

50 (e) While under the influence of alcohol or other drug;

25 (f) Creating excessive or unusual smoke;

50 (g) Carelessly, recklessly, or without regard for the
safety of any person, or in a manner that endangers, or is likely
to endanger, any person or property.

§ 261.14 Developed recreation sites.

The following are prohibited:

25 (a) Occupying any portion of the site for other than
recreation purposes.

25 (b) Building, attending, maintaining, or using a fire
outside of a fire ring provided by the Forest Service for such
purpose or outside of a stove, grill or fireplace.

20 (c) Cleaning or washing any personal property, fish, animal,
or food at a hydrant or at a water faucet not provided for that
purpose.

30 (d) Discharging or igniting a firecracker, rocket or other
firework, or explosive.

25 (e) Occupying between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. a place designated
for day use only.

20 (f) Failing to remove all camping equipment or personal
property when vacating the area or site.

20 (g) Placing, maintaining, or using camping equipment except
in a place specifically designated or provided for such equipment.

20 (h) Without permission, failing to have at least one person
occupy a camping area during the first night after camping equip-
ment has been set up.

- 20 (i) Leaving camping equipment unattended for more than 24 hours without permission.
- 25 (j) Bringing in or possessing an animal, other than a seeing eye dog, unless it is crated, caged, or upon a leash not longer than six feet, or otherwise under physical restrictive control.
- 20 (k) Bringing in or possessing in a swimming area an animal, other than a seeing eye dog.
- 20 (l) Bringing in or possessing a saddle, pack, or draft animal, except as authorized by a sign.
- 20 (m) Operating or parking a motor vehicle or trailer except in places developed for this purpose.
- 20 (n) Operating a bicycle, motorbike, or motorcycle on a trail unless designated for this use.
- 20 (o) Operating a motorbike, motorcycle, or other motor vehicle for any purpose other than entering or leaving the site.
- 20 (p) Distributing any handbill, circular, paper, or notice without a permit.
- 50 (q) Depositing any body waste except into receptacles provided for that purpose.
- 15 § 261.15 Admission, recreation use and special recreation permit fees.

Failing to pay any fee established for admission or entrance to, or use of a site, facility, equipment, or service within the National Forest System furnished by the United States is prohibited. The statutory maximum for a violation of this section is a fine of

not more than \$100.00. (Sec. 2, 78 Stat. 897, as amended; 16 USC 460~~2~~-6(e))

§ 261.16 National Forest wilderness.

The following are prohibited in a National Forest wilderness:

50 (a) Possessing or using a motor or motorized equipment except small battery-powered, hand-held devices, such as cameras, shavers, flashlights and Geiger counters.

30 (b) Possessing or using a hang glider or bicycle.

50 (c) Landing of aircraft, or the dropping or picking up of any material, supplies, or person from aircraft, except by permit or as specifically authorized by Federal law or regulation.

§ 261.17 Boundary Waters Canoe Area, Superior National Forest.

The following are prohibited in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area:

(a) Possessing or transporting any motor or other mechanical device capable of propelling a watercraft through water by any means, except by permit or as specifically authorized by Federal law or regulation.

(b) Transporting, using, or mooring amphibious craft or any type or any watercraft designed for or used as floating living quarters.

(c) Using wheels, rollers, or other mechanical devices for the overland transportation of any watercraft, except by permit or as specifically authorized by Federal law or regulation.

50 . . . § 261.18 Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail.

It is prohibited to use a motorized vehicle on the Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail without a permit.

40 . . . § 261.19 National Forest primitive areas.

It is prohibited in a National Forest primitive area to violate any prohibition in § 293.17 of this title.

§ 261.20 Unauthorized use of "Smokey Bear" and "Woodsy Owl" symbol.

50 (a) Manufacture, importation, reproduction or use of "Smokey Bear" except as provided under § 261.2, § 271.3, or § 271.4 is prohibited.

50 (b) Manufacture, importation, reproduction, or use of "Woodsy Owl" except as provided under § 262.2, § 272.3, or § 272.4 is prohibited.

Subpart B--Prohibitions in Areas Designated by Order

§ 261.50 Orders.

(a) The Chief, each Regional Forester, each Experiment Station Director, the Administrator of the Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit and each Forest Supervisor may issue orders which close or restrict the use of described areas within the area over which he has jurisdiction. An order may close an area to entry or may restrict the use of an area by applying any or all of the prohibitions authorized in this subpart or any portion thereof.

(b) The Chief, each Regional Forester, each Experiment Station Director, the Administrator of the Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit and each Forest Supervisor may issue orders which close or restrict the use of any forest development road or trail.

(c) Each order shall:

(1) For orders issued under paragraph (a), describe the area to which the order applies;

(2) For orders issued under paragraph (b), describe the road or trail to which the order applies;

(3) Specify the times during which the prohibitions apply if applied only during limited times.

(4) State each prohibition which is applied.

(5) Be posted in accordance with § 261.51.

(d) The prohibitions which are applied by an order are supplemental to the general prohibitions in Subpart A.

(e) An order may exempt any of the following persons from any of the prohibitions contained in the order:

(1) Persons with a permit authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission. The issuing officer may include in any permit such conditions as he considers necessary for the protection or administration of the road, trail, or National Forest System or for the promotion of the health, safety, or welfare of its users;

(2) Owners or lessees of land in the area;

(3) Residents in the area;

(4) Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty; and

(5) Persons engaged in a business, trade, or occupation in the area.

25 (f) It is prohibited to violate the terms or conditions of
a permit issued under (e)(1).

(g) Any person wishing to use a Forest development road or trail or a portion of the National Forest System, should contact the Forest Supervisor, Director, Administrator, or District Ranger to ascertain the special restrictions which may be applicable thereto.

§ 261.51 Posting.

Posting is accomplished by:

(a) Placing a copy of the order imposing each prohibition in the offices of the Forest Supervisor and District Ranger, or equivalent officer who have jurisdiction over the lands affected by the order, and

(b) Displaying each prohibition imposed by an order in such locations and manner as to reasonably bring the prohibition to the attention of the public.

§ 261.52 Fire.

When provided by an order, the following are prohibited:

30 (a) Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, camp-fire, or stove fire.

40 (b) Using an explosive.

40 (c) Smoking.

35 (d) Smoking, except inside a building or vehicle, or while seated in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable materials.

- 40 (e) Going into or being upon an area.
- 50 (f) Possessing, discharging or using any kind of firework or other pyrotechnic device.
- 35 (g) Entering an area without any firefighting tool prescribed by the order.
- 35 (h) Operating an internal combustion engine except on a road.
- 35 (i) Welding, or operating acetylene or other torch with open flame.
- 40 (j) Operating or using any internal or external combustion engine on any timber, brush, or grass covered land, including trails traversing such land, without a spark arrester, maintained in effective working order, meeting either (i) Department of Agriculture, Forest Service Standard 5100-1a; or (ii) the 80 percent efficiency level determined according to the approval Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE) recommended Practices J355 and J350.
- 40 (k) Violating any state law specified in the order concerning burning, fires or which is for the purpose of preventing, or restricting the spread of, fires.

40 § 261.53 Special closures.

When provided in an order, it is prohibited to go into or be upon any area which is closed for the protection of:

- (a) Threatened, endangered, rare, unique, or vanishing species of plants, animals, birds or fish.
- (b) Special biological communities.

(c) Objects or areas of historical, archaeological, geological, or paleontological interest.

(d) Scientific experiments or investigations.

(e) Public health or safety.

(f) Property."

§ 261.54 Forest development roads.

When provided by an order, the following are prohibited:

- 25 (a) Using any type of vehicle prohibited by the order.
- 25 (b) Use by any type of traffic prohibited by the order.
- 50 (c) Using a road for commercial hauling without a permit or written authorization.
- 50 (d) Operating a vehicle in violation of the speed, load, weight, height, length, width, or other limitations specified by the order.
- 40 (e) Being on the road.

§ 261.55 Forest development trails.

When provided by an order, the following are prohibited:

- 30 (a) Being on the trail.
- 30 (b) Using a bicycle or motorized vehicle.
- 30 (c) Possessing or using a saddle, pack, or draft animal.
- 30 (d) Shortcutting a switchback.

40 . . . § 261.56 Use of vehicles off forest development roads.

When provided by an order, it is prohibited to possess or use a vehicle off forest development roads.

§ 261.57 National Forest wilderness.

When provided by an order, the following are prohibited:

- 30 (a) Entering or being in the area.
- 30 (b) Possessing camping or pack-outfitting equipment, as specified in the order.
- 30 (c) Possessing a firearm or firework.
- 30 (d) Possessing any non-burnable food or beverage containers, including deposit bottles, except for non-burnable containers designed and intended for repeated use.
- 40 (e) Grazing.
- 30 (f) Storing equipment, personal property or supplies.
- 30 (g) Disposing of debris, garbage, or other waste.

§ 261.58 Occupancy and use.

When provided by an order, the following are prohibited:

- 25 (a) Camping for a period longer than allowed by the order.
- 25 (b) Entering or using a developed recreation site or portion thereof.
- 25 (c) Entering or remaining in a campground during night periods prescribed in the order except for persons who are occupying such campgrounds.
- 25 (d) Occupying a developed recreation site with prohibited camping equipment prescribed by the order.
- 25 (e) Camping.
- 25 (f) Using a campsite or other area described in the order by more than the number of users allowed by the order.

- 15 (g) Parking or leaving a vehicle in violation of a posted sign.
- 15 (h) Parking or leaving a vehicle outside a parking space assigned to one's own camp unit.
- 15 (i) Possessing, parking or leaving more than two vehicles, except motorcycles or bicycles, per camp unit.
- 25 (j) Being publicly nude.
- 25 (k) Entering or being in a body of water.
- 25 (l) Being in the area after sundown or before sunrise.
- 25 (m) Discharging a firearm, air rifle, or gas gun.
- 25 (n) Possessing or operating a motorboat.
- 25 (o) Water skiing.
- 25 (p) Storing or leaving a boat or raft.
- 25 (q) Operating any watercraft in excess of a posted speed limit.
- 25 (r) Launching a boat except at a designated launching ramp.
- 25 (s) Possessing or transporting a bird or animal.
- 25 (t) Possessing or transporting any part of a tree or plant.
- 25 (u) Being in the area between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. except a person who is camping or who is visiting a person camping in that area.
- 25 (v) Hunting or fishing.

Enclosed is a copy of the final revision of 36 CFR Part 261 Prohibitions. The regulations were published in the Federal Register on January 14, 1977 and are effective on February 15, 1977.

The revision of 36 CFR Part 261 is divided into three subparts:

Subpart A - General Prohibitions: This subpart contains those regulations that apply to all parts of the National Forest System.

Subpart B - Prohibitions in Areas Designated by Order: This subpart contains those regulations that may be applied to specific parts of the National Forest System by an order.

When a Forest Supervisor determines that one or more of these regulations are needed, he may apply them to a part of the National Forest System under his jurisdiction by issuing an "order" as outlined in Section 261.50 - Orders and "posting" the prohibition as outlined in Section 261.51 - Posting. A prohibitive regulation under this subpart will not be applied unless it is needed and the issuing unit is prepared to enforce it.

A Forest Supervisor may use any part or all of a prohibitive regulation listed (letter sub-paragraph). He may not prohibit more than what is specified in the regulation but may make it less restrictive. This subpart enables the issuing officer to specify in the order where, when, and how the regulation is to be applied.

Subpart C - Prohibitions in Regions: This subpart contains the authority and procedure for the Chief or any Regional Forester to issue prohibitive regulations that have a unique and/or or localized need and are not provided for in subparts A and B.

When a Forest Supervisor determines that a prohibitive regulation under this subpart is needed, a sample regulation with supportive evidence will be submitted to the Regional Forester requesting the regulation be issued. The Law Enforcement Staff will review the proposal and after

consultation with the originating unit, the affected functional staff and the Office of General Counsel, submit the regulation to the Federal Register under the Regional Forester's signature as required by the Administrative Procedure Act, 5 USC 553.


If the regulation is to be effective immediately upon publication as provided for in section 261.70(d), the Regional Law Enforcement Staff will notify the WO Law Enforcement Staff in Fiscal and Accounting Management who will contact the Chief for concurrence on issuing the regulation. Such concurrence will be documented by a letter to the issuing Region.

The following steps are necessary for implementation of these new regulations:

1. A workshop, dealing with implementation of the new regulations, for each Forest Law Enforcement Coordinator or alternate will be held in the Regional Office on Thursday, February 10, in the Black Oak Conference room from 8 A.M. to 5 P.M. You may send one additional staff member. We suggest recreation or the individual with ORV responsibility. Please confirm by phone to W. Derr at 556-4963 by February 7, 1977. Those attending should bring copies of all existing Forest Supervisor's orders and be familiar with the attached regulations.
2. Please review all regulations in Subparts A and B and your existing orders to determine those new regulations which need to be adopted under Subpart B. A Regional Forester's order relating to fire, wilderness, ORVs etc. will be issued in March; therefore, certain Forest Supervisor's orders dealing with these subjects will not be required until regulations, which have Region-wide applicability, have been identified in the Regional Forester's orders. Draft proposed Forest Supervisor's Orders will be prepared at the workshop relative to this situation.
3. A revised bail schedule is being developed which will approximate the existing one. We may have it adopted by each District Court by February 15, 1977. If it is not adopted by February 15, any violation notices issued must be mandatory appearances. We will advise you when it is adopted and provide copies. We will also issue new pages for the Law Enforcement Field Guide reflecting the new regulations and bail schedules.
4. You should plan to train all appropriate Forest personnel in the use and enforcement of these new regulations prior to the coming field season.
5. You should initiate an I & E effort to advise Forest users of the new regulations. The R.O. will do likewise.

Since we are now presenting the user with a somewhat different set of regulations, some of which he may be unfamiliar with, we must give special emphasis to FSM 5304 which provides that "Forest Officers may use discretion in deciding if a violation notice (Form 5300-4) should be issued for petty offenses contained in Chapter 2, Title 36 CFR..." It also states "... consideration should be given to the seriousness of the violation, the potential for damage, and the intent of the violator..." We will, therefore, exercise discretion in enforcement actions involving any new regulations by ensuring that the public has had a reasonable opportunity to become aware of, and familiar with them.

Every effort has been made to incorporate all of the comments received in the revision process. Unfortunately, in some cases many different suggestions were made concerning the same subject area requiring decisions which did not always satisfy everyone. Please do not hesitate to bring any additional needed changes (some corrections are in process) to our attention, as we begin to use the new regulations, so that further improvement can be made.

The schedule authorizing forfeiture of collateral for violations of Title 36 C.F.R., as adopted by General Order No. 41 of this Court, adopted on April 10, 1972, is hereby supplemented as follows:

1. Procedure for violations of Title 36 C.F.R. § 2.29 -
 - a. For items with a value of less than \$10, bail shall be in the amount of \$50, the offense shall be handled by citation, and the matter may be disposed of by forfeiture of bail;
 - b. For items with a value of between \$10 and \$25, bail shall be in the amount of \$50, the offense shall be handled by citation, and an appearance before the Magistrate shall be required;
 - c. For items with a value in excess of \$25, the defendant shall be arrested and brought before the Magistrate.
2. Violations of Title 36 C.F.R. § 2.32 -
 - a. For violations of Title 36 C.F.R. § 2.32(a)(1) and § 2.32(b)(2), the previously promulgated bail in the amount of \$25 is vacated, and the bail schedule is hereby amended to provide for bail for violations of said sections in the amount of \$250.
3. Violations of Title 36 C.F.R. § 2.37 -
 - a. For violations of Title 36 C.F.R. § 2.37, bail shall be set in the sum of \$50 for violations

involving small quantities, according to the following amounts and types of controlled substances:

- i. marijuana - two ounces or less;
- ii. hashish (not including hash oil) - two grams or less;
- iii. barbiturates - 25 pills or caps, or less;
- iv. amphetamines - 25 pills or caps, or less;
- v. LSD - 5 units or hits, or less.

4. Violations of Title 36 C.F.R. § 7.8(e)(1) and § 7.16(e)(3) -

a. For violations of Title 36 C.F.R. § 7.8(e)(1) or § 7.16(e)(3), bail shall be set in the sum of \$15.



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



The following regulations supplement the published Rules and Regulations governing public use of water resource developments: Title 36-Part 327 Section 327.19 Permits, dated 8 March 1979.

(c) (1) All privately owned vessels, described as fishing barges, pontoon boats, houseboats or similar vessels, operated on project waters, will require a permit issued by the Park Manager. This permit must be carried aboard the craft at all times.

(2) No watercraft of this type with a hull size exceeding an overall width of 10 feet or an overall length of 30 feet, shall be placed on these project waters.

(3) No craft of any type will utilize fuel drums, barrels, bottles, flasks or other unsafe materials for floatation.

(4) All watercraft containing a toilet or galley facility must be in conformance with applicable State, County or local ordinances.

§ 327.0 Applicability.

The regulations covered in this Part 327 shall be applicable to water resource development projects completed or under construction, administered by the Chief of Engineers, and to those portions of jointly administered water resource development projects which are under the administrative jurisdiction of the Chief of Engineers. **ALL OTHER FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT WHERE APPLICABLE TO THOSE WATER RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS.**

§ 327.1 Policy.

(a) It is the policy of the Secretary of Army acting through the Chief of Engineers to manage the natural and cultural resources of each project in the public interest, providing the public with safe and healthful recreational opportunities while protecting and enhancing these resources.

(b) Unless otherwise indicated herein, the term "District Engineer" shall include the authorized representatives of the District Engineer.

(c) The term "project" or "water resource development project" refers to the water areas of any water resource development project administered by the Chief of Engineers and to all lands owned in fee by the Federal Government and all facilities therein or thereon of any such water resource development project.

(d) All water resource development projects open for public use shall be available to the public without regard to sex, race, color, creed, or national origin. No lessee, licensee, or concessionaire providing a service to the public shall discriminate against any person because of sex, race, creed, color, or national origin in the conduct of the operations under the lease, license, or concession contract.

§ 327.2 Vehicles.

(a) This section pertains to all vehicles, including, but not limited to, automobiles, trucks, motorcycles, mini-bikes, trail bikes, snowmobiles, dune buggies, all terrain vehicles, bicycles, and trailers, campers, or any other such equipment.

(b) Vehicles shall not be parked in violation of posted restrictions, or in such a manner as to endanger any project property or environmental feature. The owner of any vehicle parked in violation of this section shall be presumed to have parked it, and unless rebutted such presumption will be sufficient to sustain a conviction as provided for in § 327.27.

(c) The operation of a vehicle off roadways is prohibited except at locations and times designated by the District Engineer.

(d) Vehicles shall be operated only in accordance with posted regulations.

(e) No person shall operate any vehicle in a careless, negligent or reckless manner so as to endanger any project property or environmental feature.

(f) At developed areas, vehicles shall be used only for ingress and egress unless otherwise posted.

(g) Except as authorized by the District Engineer no person shall operate any motorized vehicle without a proper and effective exhaust muffler, or with an exhaust muffler cutout open, or in any other manner which renders the exhaust muffler ineffective in muffling the sound of engine exhaust.

tive in muffling the sound of engine exhaust.

§ 327.3 Vessels.

(a) The placement and/or operation of any vessel or watercraft for a fee or profit upon project waters or lands is prohibited except as authorized by permit, lease, license, or concession contract with the Department of the Army. This section (327.3) shall not apply to the operation of commercial tows or passenger-carrying vessels not based at a Corps project which utilize project waters as a link in continuous transit over navigable waters of the United States.

(b) Vessels or other watercraft may be operated in project waters except in prohibited or restricted areas in accordance with posted regulations and applicable Federal, State, and local laws.

(c) The operation of vessels or other watercraft in a careless, negligent, or reckless manner so as to endanger any property or person (including the operator and/or user(s) of the vessel or watercraft) is prohibited.

(d) All vessels, when in use, shall have safety equipment on board in compliance with U.S. Coast Guard boating safety requirements (CG-290; 46 CFR 25.30; 33 CFR Part 175).

(e) Vessels or other watercraft while moored in commercial facilities, community or corporate docks, or at any fixed or permanent mooring point may only be used for overnight occupancy when such use is incidental to recreational boating. Vessels or other watercraft are not to be used as a place of habitation or residence.

(f) Water skis and similar devices are permitted in nonrestricted areas except that they may not be used in a careless, negligent, or reckless manner so as to endanger any property or person including the user or operator of the towing vessel.

(g) All vessels when not in actual use shall be removed from the project unless securely moored at mooring facilities approved by the District Engineer. The placing of floating or stationary mooring facilities to, or interfering with, a buoy, channel marker, or other navigational aid is prohibited.

(h) The use at a project of any vessel not constructed or maintained in compliance with the standards and requirements established by the National Safe Boating Act of 1971 (Pub. L. 92-75, 85 Stat. 213), or promulgated pursuant to such act, is prohibited.

(i) The discharge or placing of sewage, galley waste, garbage, refuse, metal cans or pollutants into the project waters from any vessel or watercraft is prohibited.

(j) Except as authorized by the District Engineer, no person shall operate any vessel or watercraft without a

proper and effective exhaust muffler, or with an exhaust muffler cutout open, or in any other manner which renders the exhaust muffler ineffective in muffling the sound of engine exhaust.

§ 327.4 Aircraft.

(a) The operation of aircraft on project lands other than at the landing areas designated by the District Engineer is prohibited.

(b) Any use of project waters by aircraft is subject to the following restrictions:

(1) Such use is limited to seaplanes at the risk of the owner, operator, and passenger(s).

(2) Seaplane operations contrary to the prohibitions or restrictions established by the District Engineer (pursuant to Part 328 of this title) are prohibited. The responsibility to ascertain whether or not projects, or portions thereof, are available for seaplane operations or whether seaplane operations are prohibited or restricted is incumbent upon the person(s) contemplating the use of, or using, such waters.

(3) All operations of seaplanes while upon project waters shall be in accordance with marine rules of the road for power boats or vessels.

(4) Seaplanes on project waters and lands in excess of 24 hours shall be securely moored at mooring facilities and at locations permitted by the District Engineer. Seaplanes may be temporarily moored on project waters and lands, except in areas prohibited by the District Engineer, for periods less than 24 hours providing that the mooring is safe, secure, and accomplished so as not to damage the rights of the Government or members of the public and (ii) the operator remains in the vicinity of the seaplane and reasonable available to relocate the seaplane if necessary.

(5) Commercial operation of seaplanes from project waters is prohibited without written approval of the District Engineer following consultation with and necessary clearance from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and other appropriate public authorities and affected interests.

(6) No person shall operate any seaplane while on or above project waters or adjacent project land in a careless, negligent, or reckless manner so as to endanger any person or property. Seaplanes may not be operated at Corps projects between sunset and sunrise unless adequate lighting and supervision are available.

(c) Nothing in the preceding provisions bestows authority to deviate from rules and regulations or prescribed standards of the appropriate State Aeronautical Agency, or the

Federal Aviation Administration, including but not limited to regulations and standards concerning pilot certifications or ratings, and airspace requirements.

(d) Except in extreme emergencies threatening human life or serious property loss, the air delivery of any person or thing by parachute, helicopter or other means onto project lands or waters without written permission of the District Engineer is prohibited.

(e) The provisions of this section shall not be applicable to aircraft engaged on official business of the Federal Government or used in emergency rescue in accordance with the directions of the District Engineer or forced to land due to circumstances beyond the control of the operator.

§ 327.5 Swimming.

Swimming, diving, snorkeling, or scuba diving at one's own risk is permitted, except at launching sites and other areas designated by the District Engineer.

§ 327.6 Picnicking.

(a) Picnicking is permitted, except in those areas where prohibited by the District Engineer.

(b) Picnickers shall keep their sites free of trash and litter during the period of occupancy and shall remove all personal equipment and clean their sites upon departure.

§ 327.7 Camping.

(a) Camping is permitted only at sites and/or areas designated by the District Engineer.

(b) Camping at one or more campsites at any one project for a period longer than 14 consecutive days is prohibited without the written permission of the District Engineer. Written permission is required to camp at any project in excess of 14 days during any 30-day period.

(c) The placement of camping equipment on a campsite or intermittent personal appearance at a campsite for the purpose of reserving a designated campsite for future occupancy is prohibited without the written permission of the District Engineer.

(d) The digging or leveling of any ground or the construction of any structure without written permission of the District Engineer is prohibited.

(e) Campers shall keep their campsites free of trash and litter during the period of occupancy and shall clean their campsites and remove all personal equipment upon departure.

§ 327.8 Hunting, fishing, trapping.

Hunting, fishing, and trapping are permitted in accordance with applicable Federal, State, and local laws except in areas designated by the District Engineer.

§ 327.9 Sanitation.

(a) Garbage, trash, rubbish, litter, or any other waste material or waste liquid generated on the project and incidental to authorized recreational activities shall be either removed from the project or deposited in receptacles provided for that purpose. The improper disposal of such wastes on the project is prohibited.

(b) The use of refuse containers or other refuse facilities for dumping or disposal of household or commercial garbage, trash, rubbish, debris, sewage, dead animals, or litter of any kind brought onto the project is prohibited.

(c) It is a violation to bring onto a project any material for the purpose of disposal without written permission of the District Engineer.

§ 327.10 Fires.

(a) Gasoline and other fuels, except that which is contained in storage tanks of vehicles, vessels, camping equipment, or hand portable containers, shall not be carried onto or stored within the project without written permission of the District Engineer.

(b) Fires shall be confined to those areas designated by the District Engineer, and shall be confined to fireplaces, grills, or other facilities designed for this purpose. Fires shall not be left unattended and must be completely extinguished prior to departure.

(c) The gathering of wood is prohibited without written permission of the District Engineer except for the gathering of dead material on the ground for use in designated recreation areas.

§ 327.11 Control of animals.

(a) No person shall bring, or allow horses, cattle, or other livestock in camping, picnic, swimming, or other recreation areas except in areas designated by the District Engineer.

(b) No person shall bring dogs, cats, or other pets into developed recreation areas unless penned, caged, or on a leash under 6 feet in length, or otherwise under physical restraint at all times. No animals or pets are permitted in swimming beach areas. Unclaimed or unattended animals are subject to immediate impoundment and removal in accordance with State and local laws.

(c) Allowing unauthorized livestock to enter upon or to be upon project lands and failing or refusing to remove unauthorized livestock from such lands when requested by the District Engineer is prohibited.

(d) Any violation of paragraph (a), (b), or (c) of this section shall constitute a separate violation for each calendar day in which it occurs.

§ 327.12 Restrictions.

(a) The District Engineer may establish and post a schedule of visiting hours and/or restrictions on the public use of a project or portion of a project. The District Engineer may close or restrict the use of a project or portion of a project when necessitated by reason of public health, public safety, maintenance, or other reasons in the public interest. Entering or using a project in a manner which is contrary to the schedule of visiting hours closure or restrictions is prohibited.

(b) Quiet shall be maintained in all public use areas between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. Excessive noise during such times which unreasonably disturbs persons is prohibited.

(c) The operation or use of any audio or other noise producing device including but not limited to communications media and motorized equipment or vehicles in such a manner as to unreasonably annoy or endanger persons is prohibited.

§ 327.13 Explosive, firearms, other weapons and fireworks.

(a) The possession of loaded firearms, ammunition, loaded projectile firing devices, bows and arrows, cross bows, and explosive of any kind is prohibited unless: (1) in the possession of a State or local law enforcement officer on official business; or (2) in the possession of a Federal Government employee with law enforcement authority and on official business as approved by the District Engineer; or (3) to be used for hunting and fishing as permitted under § 327.8; or (4) to be used at authorized shooting ranges; or (5) written permission has been received from the District Engineer.

(b) The possession or use of fireworks is prohibited unless written permission has been received from the District Engineer.

§ 327.14 Public property.

Destruction, injury, defacement, removal, or any alteration of public property, including, but not limited to constructed facilities, natural formations, historical and archeological features, and vegetative growth, is prohibited without the written permission of the District Engineer. Any such destruction, removal, or alteration of public property shall be in accordance with the conditions of any permission granted.

§ 327.15 Abandonment of personal property.

(a) Personal property of any kind shall not be abandoned or left unattended upon project lands or waters. After a period of 24 hours, unattended personal property may be impounded and stored at a storage point designated

by the District Engineer, who may assess a reasonable impoundment fee. Such fee shall be paid before the impounded property is returned to its owners.

(b) The District Engineer shall by public or private sale or otherwise, dispose of all lost, abandoned, or unclaimed personal property that comes into Government custody or control. However, property may not be disposed of until diligent effort has been made to find the owner, heirs or next of kin, or legal representative(s). If the owner, heirs or next of kin, or legal representative(s) are determined but not found, the property may not be disposed of until the expiration of 120 days after the date when notice, giving the time and place of the intended sale or other disposition, has been sent by certified or registered mail to that person at the last known address. When diligent effort to determine the owner, heirs or next of kin, or legal representative(s) is unsuccessful, the property may be disposed of without delay, except that if it has a fair market value of \$25 or more the property may not be disposed of until 3 months after the date it is received at the storage point designated by the District Engineer. The net proceeds from the sale of property shall be covered into the Treasury of the United States as miscellaneous receipts.

§ 327.16 Lost and found articles.

All lost articles shall be deposited by the finder at the Park Manager's office or with a ranger. The finder may leave his/her name, address, and phone number. All lost articles shall be disposed of in accordance with the procedures set forth in § 327.15.

§ 327.17 Advertisement.

Advertising by the use of billboards, signs, markers, audio devices, or any other means whatsoever including handbills, circulars, and posters is prohibited without written permission of the District Engineer. Vessels and vehicles with semipermanent or permanent painted or installed signs are exempt as long as they are used for authorized recreational activities and comply with all other rules and regulations pertaining to vessels and vehicles.

§ 327.18 Commercial activities.

The engaging in or solicitation of business without the express written agreement of the District Engineer is prohibited.

§ 327.19 Permits.

(a) It shall be a violation of these regulations to refuse to or fail to comply with the terms on conditions of any permit issued under the provisions of this regulation.

(b) Permits for floating structures of any kind in waters of water resources development projects, whether or not such waters are deemed navigable waters of the United States but where such waters are under the management of the Corps of Engineers Park Manager, shall be issued at the discretion of the District Engineer under the authority of this regulation. District Engineers will delineate those portions of the navigable waters of the United States where this provision is applicable and post notices of this designation, in the vicinity of the Park Manager's office.

(c) Permits for nonfloating structures of any kind constructed, placed in or affecting waters of water resource development projects where such waters are deemed navigable waters of the United States shall be issued under the provisions of Section 10 of the Act approved March 3, 1899, 33 U.S.C. 403. If a discharge of dredged or fill material in these waters is involved, a permit is required under Section 404 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1344). (See 33 CFR Parts 320-329.)

(d) Permits for nonfloating structures of any kind in waters of water resource development projects where such waters are under the management of a Corps of Engineers Park Manager and where such waters are not deemed navigable waters of the United States shall be issued as set forth in paragraph (b) of this section. If a discharge of dredged or fill material into any water of the United States is involved, a permit is required under Section 404 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1344). (See 33 CFR Parts 320-329.)

§ 327.20 Unauthorized structures.

The construction, placing, or continued existence of any structure of any kind under, upon, in, or over the project lands or waters is prohibited unless a permit, lease, license, or other appropriate written agreement therefore has been issued by the District Engineer. Structures not so authorized are subject to summary removal or impoundment by the District Engineer. The design, construction, placing, existence, or use of structures in violation of the terms of the permit, lease, license, or other written agreement therefore is prohibited.

§ 327.21 Special events.

(a) Special events including but not limited to water carnivals, boat regattas, music festivals, dramatic presentations, or other special recreation programs are prohibited unless written permission has been granted by the District Engineer.

(c) The public shall not be charged any fee by the sponsor of such event unless the District Engineer has approved in writing the proposed schedule of fees. The District Engineer shall have authority to revoke permission and require removal of any equipment upon failure of the sponsor to comply with terms and conditions of the permit/permission or with regulations in this Part 327. Any violation shall constitute a separate violation for each calendar day in which it occurs.

§ 327.22 Unauthorized occupation.

(a) Occupying any lands, buildings, vessels, or other facilities within water resource development projects for the purpose of maintaining same as a full- or part-time residence without the written authorization of the District Engineer is prohibited. The provisions of this section shall not apply to the occupation of lands for the purpose of camping in accordance with the provisions of § 327.7.

(b) The ranging, grazing, or watering of livestock on project lands and waters is prohibited except when authorized by lease, license, or other agreement with the District Engineer. Any violation shall constitute a separate violation for each calendar day in which it occurs.

§ 327.23 Outgranted lands.

Applicable laws and regulations of State and local governments shall be deemed to apply on project lands or waters which are outgranted by the District Engineer by lease, license, or other written agreement to State and local governments; provided, however, that the regulations in this Part 327 are deemed to apply to such outgranted project lands and waters as a minimum regulatory requirement.

§ 327.24 Indian lands.

The regulations in this Part 327 shall be deemed to apply to those lands and waters which are subject to treaties and Federal laws and regulations concerning the rights of Indian Nations and which lands and waters are incorporated, in whole or in part, within water resource development projects administered by the Chief of Engineers to the extent that the regulations in this Part 327 are not inconsistent with such treaties and Federal law and regulations.

§ 327.25 Recreation use fees.

(a) Section 2 of 26 Stat. 433 (Golden Eagle Passport Program, Pub. L. 92-347), which amends 78 Stat. 897 (The Public Land and Water Conservation Fund Act of 1963, Pub. L. 88-578), created a new Section 4(b) which requires Federal agencies developing, administering, or providing specialized sites, facilities, equipment, or services relat-

ed to outdoor recreation to collect special recreation use fees for the use of sites, facilities, equipment, or services furnished at Federal expense. The new Section 4(a), however, prohibits the Corps of Engineers from collecting entrance fees to projects. Section 210 of 82 Stat. 745 (Pub. L. 90-433) also prohibits the United States from collecting entrance or admission fees to Corps projects.

(b) At water resources development projects administered by the Secretary of the Army, acting through the Chief of Engineers, fees will not be charged for use in any combination of drinking water, wayside exhibits, roads, overlook sites, visitor centers, scenic drives, toilet facilities, picnic tables or boat ramps (except if mechanical or hydraulic boat lifts are provided).

(c) In addition, fees will not be charged for use of campgrounds which do not have the following: Designated tent or trailer spaces, drinking water, access roads, refuse containers, toilet facilities, personal fee collection, reasonable visitor protection, and simple devices for containing campfires (if campfires are permitted).

(d) At each Corps lake or reservoir where camping is permitted, the District Engineer will provide at least one primitive campground, containing designated campsites, sanitary facilities, and vehicular access, where no fees will be charged.

(e) All use fees shall be fair and equitable and will be based on the following criteria:

(1) The direct and indirect amount of Federal expenditure.

(2) The benefit to the recipient.

(3) The public policy or interest served.

(4) The comparable recreation fees charged by other Federal and non-Federal public agencies within the service area of the management unit at which the fee is charged.

(5) The economic and administrative feasibility of fee collection.

(6) The extent of regular maintenance required.

(7) Other pertinent factors.

Based upon the above criteria, it shall be the policy of the Chief of Engineers to publish in the FEDERAL REGISTER as a general notice document, the established range of fees for recreation facilities, whenever such fees are adjusted. Fees for specialized outdoor recreation facilities not mentioned above may also be established in accordance with the criteria listed in this paragraph.

(f) Any Golden Age Passport permittee shall be entitled upon presentation of such a permit to utilize special recreation facilities at a rate of 50 percent off the established use fee.

(g) Golden Eagle Passports however, do not affect the charging of use fees,

since they apply only to entrance fees, which are not charged by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

(h) The District Engineer shall insure that clear notice that a fee has been established is prominently posted at each such area and at appropriate locations therein, and that it be included in publications distributed at such areas.

(i) Failure to pay authorized recreation use fees as established pursuant to Pub. L. 88-578, 78 Stat. 897, as amended, 16 U.S.C. 4601-6a is prohibited and is punishable by a fine of not more than \$100.

§ 327.26 Interference with government employees.

Interference with any Government employee in the conduct of his or her official duties pertaining to the administration of these regulations is prohibited. It is a violation to fail to comply with a lawful order directed by any Government employee in the performance of his or her official duties pertaining to the administration of these regulations.

§ 327.27 Violation of rules and regulations.

Except for violations coming within the scope of § 327.25 in accordance with Section 234 of the River and Harbor Act of 1970 (84 Stat. 1619, 16 U.S.C. 460d, as amended), violations of the provisions of this regulation shall subject the violator to a fine of not more than \$500 or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. Any person charged with such violation may be tried and sentenced in accordance with the provisions of Section 3401 of Title 18, United States Code. All persons designated by the Chief of Engineers for that purpose shall have the authority to issue a citation for violation of these regulations, requiring the appearance of any person charged with violation to appear before the U.S. magistrate within whose jurisdiction the water resource development project is located. (Section 4, 58 Stat. 889, as amended; 16 U.S.C. 460d).

FEDERAL PROPERTY MANAGEMENT BAIL SCHEDULE

AUTHORITY:

These rules and regulations are promulgated pursuant to Public Law 566, 80th Congress, approved June 1, 1948 (40 U.S.C. 318); and the Federal Property and Administrative Services Act of 1949 (63 Stat. 377), as amended.

APPLICABILITY:

These rules and regulations apply to all property under the charge and control of the General Services Administration and to all persons entering in or on such property. Each occupant agency shall be responsible for the observance of the rules and regulations.

INSPECTIONS:

Packages, briefcases, and other containers brought into, while on, or being removed from the property are subject to inspection. A full search of a person may accompany an arrest.

ADMISSION TO PROPERTY:

Property shall be closed to the public during other than normal work hours. The closing of property will not apply to that space and in those instances where the Government has approved the after-normal-working hours use of buildings or portions thereof for activities authorized by Subpart 101-20.7. During normal working hours, property shall be closed to the public only when situations require this action to ensure the orderly conduct of Government business. The decision to close the property shall be made by the designated official under the Occupant Emergency Program after consultation with the buildings manager and the ranking representative of the Federal Protective Service Division responsible for protection of the facility or the area. This requirement does not preempt the authority of the Regional Director, Federal Protective Service Division, or any other authorized GSA official to effect a security alert of a facility in accordance with GSA Order, physical Security of Buildings Alert Guidelines (PBS 5930.16), dated February 20, 1976. This action shall be coordinated with the designated official. The designated official is defined in § 101-20.504-3(f) as the highest ranking official of the primary occupant agency, or the designee selected by mutual agreement by other occupant agency officials. When property, or a portion thereof, is closed to the public, admission to this property, or

a portion, will be restricted to authorized persons who shall, when requested display Government or other identifying credentials to the Federal Protective Officers or other authorized individuals when entering, leaving, or while on the property. Failure to comply with any of the above applicable provisions is a violation of these regulations.

PRESERVATION OF PROPERTY:

The improper disposal of rubbish on property; the willful destruction of or damage to property; the theft of property; the creation of any hazard on property to persons or things; the throwing of articles of any kind from or at a building or the climbing upon statues, fountains, or any part of the building is prohibited.

CONFORMITY WITH SIGNS AND DIRECTIONS:

Persons in and on property shall at all times comply with official signs of a prohibitory, regulatory, or directory nature and with the direction of Federal Protective Officers and other authorized individuals.

Entering upon the property, under the influence of or using or possessing any narcotic drug, hallucinogen, marijuana, barbiturate, or amphetamine is prohibited. The use of alcoholic beverages on property is prohibited except, upon occasions and on property upon which the head of the responsible agency or his or her designee has for appropriate official uses granted an exemption in writing. The head of the responsible agency or his or her designee shall provide a copy of all exemptions granted to the buildings manager who shall inform the Federal Protective Officer, or other authorized officials, responsible for the security of the property.

SOLICITING, VENDING, AND DEBT COLLECTION:

Soliciting alms, commercial or political soliciting, and vending of all kinds, displaying or distributing commercial advertising, or collecting private debts on GSA-controlled property is prohibited. This rule does not apply to (a) national or local drives for funds for welfare, health, or other purposes as authorized by the "Manual on Fund Raising Within the Federal Service," issued by the U.S. Office of Personnel Management under Executive Order 10927 of March 18, 1961, and sponsored or approved by the occupant agencies; (b) concessions or personal notices posted by employees on authorized bulletin boards; (c) solicitation of labor organization membership or dues authorized by occupant agencies under the Civil Service Reform Act of 1978 (Pub. L. 95-454); and (d) lessee, or its agents and employees, with respect to space leased for commercial, cultural, educational, or recreational use under the Public Buildings Cooperative Use Act of 1976 (40 U.S.C. 490(a)(16)). Public areas of GSA-controlled property may be used for other activities permitted in accordance with subpart 101-20.7.

Proof that a motor vehicle was parked in violation of these regulations or directives may be taken as prima facie evidence that the registered owner was responsible for the violation.

(a) The following are prohibited:

(1) Possessing, destroying, injuring, defacing, removing, or disturbing from its natural state living or dead wildlife, fish, aquatic wildlife, plants, nonfossilized and fossilized paleontological specimens, or parts thereof, or a mineral resource, except as otherwise provided in this chapter.

(2) Possessing, destroying, injuring, defacing, removing, or disturbing a structure or its furnishings or fixtures, or other cultural or archeological resource.

(3) Introducing wildlife, fish, aquatic wildlife, or plants, including their reproductive bodies, into a park area ecosystem, except under conditions established by the superintendent.

(4) Leaving a designated or maintained trail to shortcut between portions of the same trail or an adjacent trail.

(5) Engaging in an activity such as walking, climbing, ascending, descending, or traversing on an archeological or cultural resource, or a monument or statue, except in designated areas and under conditions established by the superintendent.

(6) Tossing, throwing or rolling rocks or other items inside caves or caverns, into valleys, canyons, or caverns, down hillsides or mountainsides, or into thermal features.

(7) Removing firewood from a park area except under such conditions as the superintendent may establish.

(b)(1) Designated natural products of a renewable nature (such as fruits, berries, nuts, or unoccupied seashells) may be gathered or possessed for personal use or consumption. The superintendent may limit the size and quantity of the items which may be gathered or possessed for this purpose.

(2) The following are prohibited:

(i) Gathering or possessing undesignated natural products.

(ii) Gathering or possessing natural products in excess of the size and quantity designated by the superintendent.

(iii) Unauthorized removal of natural products from the park area.

(iv) Sale or commercial use of natural products.

(c) Mineral or metal detectors.

Possessing or using a mineral or metal detector, magnetometer, side scan sonar or other metal detecting device, or subbottom profiler is prohibited. This section does not apply to:

(1) Such a device which is broken down and stored or packed to prevent its use while in park areas.

(2) Electronic equipment used primarily for the navigation and safe operation of boats and aircraft.

(3) Mineral or metal detectors, magnetometers, or subbottom profilers used for authorized scientific, mining, or administrative use.

§ 2.2 Wildlife protection.

(a) The following are prohibited:

(1) The taking of wildlife, except by authorized hunting and trapping activities conducted in accordance with paragraph (b) of this section.

(2) The feeding, touching, teasing, frightening or intentional disturbing of wildlife, nesting, breeding or other activities.

(3) Possessing unlawfully taken wildlife or portions thereof.

(4) Discharging a weapon, except for the purpose of taking wildlife.

(c) Except in emergencies or in areas
under the exclusive jurisdiction of the
United States, the superintendent shall
consult with appropriate State agencies
before invoking the authority of § 1.5 of
his chapter for the purpose of restricting
or closing park areas to the taking of
fish or aquatic wildlife.

(d) Except in areas otherwise
designated by the superintendent, the
following are prohibited:

(1) Fishing from, or within 200 feet of,
a public raft or float designated for
water sports, or within the limits of
designated mooring areas or harbors,
swimming beaches, surfing areas, or
public boat docks.

(2) Fishing from motor road bridges.

(3) Fishing or the taking of aquatic
wildlife by the use of drugs, poisons,
explosives, electricity, or fish traps.

(4) Digging for bait, except on
privately owned lands.

(5) Commercial fishing in fresh waters,
except where specifically authorized by
Federal law.

(e) Fish or aquatic wildlife that does
not meet size or species restrictions, or

at the time of catching the person does
not possess the legal limit of fish or
aquatic wildlife.

(f) A person taking fish or aquatic
wildlife, or who can reasonably be
presumed to have been engaged in these
activities, shall allow inspection by an
authorized person of all fishing licenses,
permits, tackle, and the contents of
creels, or other containers that can
reasonably be used to transport or store
fish or aquatic wildlife.

(g) Except as otherwise designated,
the following are prohibited in the fresh
waters of park areas:

(1) Possessing live or dead minnows,
chubs, other bait fish, amphibians,
nonpreserved fish eggs and fish roe, or
the use thereof as bait.

(2) Chumming or placing of preserved
or fresh fish eggs, fish roe, food, fish
parts, chemicals or other foreign
substances in waters (except legal bait)
for the purpose of feeding or attracting
fish to a particular location in order that
they may be taken.

(3) Fishing with a net, seine, trap,
spear, other weapon, or in any manner
other than by hook and line, with the
rod or line being closely attended.

(h) Except as otherwise designated,

(e) The superintendent may issue permits authorizing the carrying or possession of a weapon, trap or net. Violation of the terms and conditions of a permit issued under this section may result in the revocation of the permit and such other restrictions as are prescribed in this chapter.		100	200
(f) Authorized Federal, State and local law enforcement officers may carry firearms in the performance of their official duties.			
(g) The carrying or possessing of a weapon, trap or net in violation of			

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applicable Federal and State laws is prohibited.

(h) The regulations in this section shall be applicable on the privately owned lands under the legislative jurisdiction of the United States.

2.5 Research specimens.

(a) Collecting plants, fish, aquatic wildlife, wildlife and minerals other than as may be allowed pursuant to other regulations of this chapter is prohibited, except pursuant to the terms and conditions of a specimen collection permit. A permit may be issued only to an official representative of a reputable scientific or educational institution which will utilize such specimens for research, group study or museum display.

(b) A permit for a collection program which requires the killing of biota may be issued only in the following circumstances:

(1) The taking of wildlife is authorized by the enabling legislation of the park area for which the permit is sought, and the Regional Director determines that collection will benefit science.

(2) The taking of wildlife is not prohibited in the enabling legislation of the park area for which the permit is sought, and the Regional Director determines that collection has the potential of providing information that can help better manage and protect park resources.

(c) In addition to the conditions of paragraph (b) of this section, a permit to secure a rare natural object will be granted by the Director only if such object cannot be secured elsewhere and is needed for special scientific use.

(d) A permit may not be issued for the collection of a specimen if its removal would disturb remaining natural features or mar their appearance.

(e) Violation of the terms and conditions of a permit issued in accordance with this section may result in the revocation of the permit and such other restrictions as are prescribed in this chapter.

2.10 Camping and food storage.

(a) In developed areas, the superintendent may designate sites or areas as available for camping. In undeveloped areas, the superintendent may require permits, designate sites or areas, and establish conditions for camping.

(b) The following are prohibited:

(1) Digging or leveling the ground at a campsite.

(2) Leaving camping equipment, temporary alterations, or refuse after departing from the campsite.

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(3) In nondeveloped areas, operating or using any type of portable motor or engine, or device powered by a portable motor or engine, except pursuant to the terms and conditions of a permit issued under this section. This paragraph does not apply to outboard motors in areas where outboard motor boating is allowed, and electric generating plants used in the operation of vessels.

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(4) Operating or using a public address system, except when in connection with a public gathering or special event for which a permit has been issued pursuant to §§ 2.50 or 2.51.

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(b) Violation of the terms and conditions of a permit issued under this section may result in the revocation of the permit and such other restrictions as are prescribed in this chapter.

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§ 2.13 Fires.

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(a) The following are prohibited:

(1) Lighting or maintaining a fire, except in designated areas or receptacles and under conditions which may be established by the superintendent.

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(2) Use of stoves or lanterns in violation of use restrictions or in areas which the superintendent may designate as closed to such use.

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(3) Lighting or tending a fire, stove or lantern in a manner which threatens, causes damage to, or results in the burning of property, real property or park resources, or creates a public safety hazard.

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(4) Leaving a fire unattended.

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(5) Throwing or discarding lighted or smoldering material in a manner which threatens, causes damage to, or results in the burning of property or park resources, or creates a public safety hazard.

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(b) Fires shall be extinguished upon termination of use and in accordance with such conditions as may be established by the superintendent.

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(c) The regulations in this section shall be applicable on the privately owned lands under the legislative jurisdiction of the United States.

§ 2.14 Sanitation and refuse.

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(a) The following are prohibited:

(1) Disposing refuse in other than refuse receptacles.

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(2) Using government refuse receptacles or other refuse facilities for dumping household, commercial, or industrial refuse, brought as such from private or municipal property, except in accordance with such conditions as may be established by the superintendent.

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(3) Depositing refuse in the plumbing fixtures or vaults of a toilet facility.

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(4) Draining refuse from a trailer or other vehicle, except in facilities provided for such purpose.

(5) Bathing, or washing food, clothing, dishes, or other property at public water outlets or fixtures, except at those designated for such purpose.

(6) Polluting or contaminating a drinking water supply.

(7) Disposing fish remains or the remains of aquatic wildlife on land, or in waters within 200 feet of boat docks or designated swimming beaches, or within developed areas, except as otherwise designated.

(b) *Human body waste*--(1) The disposal of human body waste is prohibited in developed areas, except at designated locations or in fixtures provided for that purpose.

(2) In nondeveloped areas, the disposal of human body waste within 100 feet of a water source, high water mark of a body of water, or a campsite, or within sight of a trail, is prohibited.

(3) The superintendent may establish conditions concerning the disposal, containerization, or carryout of human body waste. Violation of these conditions is prohibited.

2.15 Pets.

(a) The following are prohibited:

(1) Possessing a pet in a public building, public transportation vehicle, structure of area closed to pets, or designated swimming area. This subparagraph shall not apply to guide dogs accompanying visually impaired persons or hearing ear dogs accompanying hearing impaired persons.

(2) Failing to crate, cage, physically confine, or restrain a pet with a leash which shall not exceed six feet in length.

(3) Leaving a pet unattended and tied to an object, except in designated areas or under conditions which may be established by the superintendent.

(4) Allowing a pet to make noise which is unreasonable or threatens wildlife by barking, howling, or making other noise.

(5) Failing to comply with pet excrement disposal conditions which may be established by the superintendent.

(b) In park areas where hunting is allowed, dogs may be used in accordance with applicable Federal and State laws.

(c) Pets or feral animals which are running-at-large and observed by an authorized person in the act of killing, injuring or molesting humans, livestock, or wildlife may be destroyed if necessary for public safety or protection of wildlife.

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(d) Pets running-at-large may be impounded, and the owner may be charged reasonable fees for kennel or boarding costs, feed, veterinarian fees, and disposal. Unless otherwise provided by State law, an impounded pet may be put up for adoption or otherwise disposed of after being held for 72 hours.

(e) Pets may be kept by residents of park areas consistent with the provisions of this section and in accordance with conditions which may be established by the superintendent.

§ 2.16 Horses and pack animals.

The following are prohibited:

(a) The use of animals other than those designated as "pack animals" for purposes of transporting equipment.

(b) The use of horses and pack animals outside of designated trails, routes or areas.

(c) The use of horses or pack animals on a park road, except where such travel is necessary for ingress to or egress from trails or privately owned property, or otherwise allowed by designation.

(d) Free-trailing or loose-herding of horses or pack animals on trails.

(e) Allowing horses or pack animals to proceed in excess of a slow walk when passing persons on foot or bicycle.

(f) Obstructing a trail, or making an unreasonable noise or gesture while horses or pack animals are in the vicinity.

(g) Violation of conditions which may be established by the superintendent concerning the use of horses and pack animals.

§ 2.17 Aircraft and air delivery.

(a) The following are prohibited:

(1) Operating or using aircraft on lands or waters other than at designated take-off or landing areas, except pursuant to the terms and conditions of a permit.

(2) Operating or using aircraft under power on the water within 500 feet of designated swimming beaches, boat docks, piers, or ramps, except as otherwise designated.

(3) Delivering a person or object by parachute, helicopter, or other means of air delivery, except in emergencies involving public safety or serious property loss, or pursuant to the terms and conditions of a permit. For the purposes of this subparagraph, "delivery" means the act of conveying or releasing persons or property.

(b) Violation of the terms and conditions of a permit issued under this section may result in the revocation of the permit and such other restrictions as are prescribed in this chapter.

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The provisions of this section shall be applicable to aircraft engaged in official business of the Federal government, or used in emergency rescue in accordance with the directions of the superintendent, or forced to land due to circumstances beyond the control of the operator.

(d)(1) Except as provided in paragraph (d)(3) of this section, the owners of a downed aircraft shall remove the aircraft and all component parts thereof in accordance with procedures established by the superintendent. In establishing removal procedures, the superintendent is authorized to: (i) Establish a reasonable date by which aircraft removal operations must be complete; (ii) Determine times and means of access to and from the downed aircraft; and (iii) Specify the manner or method of removal.

(2) Failure to comply with procedures and conditions established under paragraph (d)(1) is prohibited, except that the owner of the downed aircraft or an authorized representative thereof may remove component parts at the time of incident or within a reasonable period thereafter without obtaining a permit.

(3) The superintendent may waive the requirements of paragraph (d)(1) or prohibit the removal of downed aircraft, upon a determination that: (i) The removal of downed aircraft would constitute an unacceptable risk to human life; (ii) The removal of a downed aircraft would result in extensive resource damage; or (iii) The removal of a downed aircraft is impracticable or impossible.

(e) The operation of aircraft shall be in accordance with regulations of the Federal Aviation Administration.

§ 2.18 Snowmobiles.

(a) Notwithstanding the definition of vehicle set forth in § 4.2 (a) and (b), the provisions of §§ 4.6, 4.8, 4.9, 4.13, 4.14, 4.15, 4.16, 4.18 and 4.20 of this chapter shall apply to snowmobiles.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the laws of the State in which the exterior boundaries of a park area or a portion thereof is located shall govern equipment standards and the operation of snowmobiles. Such nonconflicting State laws which are now or may hereafter be in effect are adopted and made a part of these regulations.

(c) The use of snowmobiles is prohibited, except on designated routes and water surfaces which are used by motorized vehicles or motorboats during other seasons. Snowmobiles shall not be allowed except where designated and only when their use is consistent with

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park's natural, cultural, scenic and aesthetic values, safety considerations, park management objectives, and will not disturb wildlife or damage park resources. Routes and water surfaces designated for snowmobile use shall be promulgated as special regulations in Part 7 of this chapter.

(d) The following are prohibited:

(1) Operating a snowmobile which makes excessive noise. Excessive noise for snowmobiles manufactured after July 1, 1975 is a level of total snowmobile noise that exceeds 78 decibels measured on the A-weighted scale in intensity of a sound meter, measured at a distance of not less 50 feet when the snowmobile is being operated (at or near full throttle.)

Snowmobiles manufactured between July 1, 1973 and July 1, 1975 will not register more than 82 decibels on the A scale at 50 feet. Snowmobiles manufactured prior to July 1, 1973 will not register more than 86 decibels on the A weighted scale at 50 feet.

(2) Operating a snowmobile without a lighted white headlamp and red taillight from one half-hour after sunset to one half-hour before sunrise, or when persons and vehicles are not clearly visible for a distance of 500 feet.

(3) Operating a snowmobile which does not have brakes in good working order.

(4) Operating a snowmobile in excess of 45 mph, unless otherwise designated or restricted in accordance with § 4.14 of this chapter.

(e) Except where State law prescribes a different minimum age or qualification for the person providing direct supervision and accompaniment, the following are prohibited:

(1) The operation of a snowmobile by a person under 16 years of age unless accompanied and supervised within line of sight by a responsible person 21 years of age or older;

(2) The operation of a snowmobile by a person under 12 years of age, unless accompanied on the same machine by a responsible person 21 years of age or older, or

(3) The supervision by one person of the operation of snowmobiles by more than one person under 16 years of age.

§ 2.19 Winter activities.

(a) The superintendent may designate areas where skiing, snowshoeing, ice skating, and similar winter sports are prohibited. Such sports are prohibited on roads and in parking areas which are open to motor vehicle traffic.

(b) Sledding, inner tubing, and tobogganing are allowed, unless restricted to designated areas or prohibited by the superintendent.

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(c) The towing of persons on skis, sleds, or other sliding devices by motor vehicle or snowmobile is prohibited, except in designated areas or routes. This paragraph shall not apply to sleds designed to be towed behind snowmobiles which are joined to the snowmobile with a rigid hitching mechanism.

(d) Failure to abide by area designations or activity restrictions established under this section is prohibited.

§ 2.20 Skating, skateboards, and similar devices.

Using roller skates, skateboards, roller skis, coasting vehicles, or similar devices is prohibited, except in designated areas.

§ 2.21 Smoking.

(a) The superintendent may designate a portion of a park area, all or a portion of a building, structure, or facility as closed to smoking when necessary to protect park resources, reduce the risk of fire, or prevent conflicts among visitor use activities. Smoking in an area so designated is prohibited.

(b) Smoking is prohibited within all caves and caverns.

§ 2.22 Property.

(a) *Abandoned property.* Abandoning property is prohibited.

(b) *Unattended property.* Except in areas where longer time periods have been designated, leaving property unattended for longer than 24 hours is prohibited, except in accordance with conditions which may be established by the superintendent.

(c) *Found property.* All found property shall be turned in to the superintendent as soon as practicable.

(d) *Impoundment of property.* (1) Property determined to be left unattended in excess of an allowed period of time may be impounded by the superintendent.

(2) Unattended property that interferes with visitor safety or presents a threat to park resources may be impounded by the superintendent at any time.

(3) Found or impounded property shall be inventoried to determine ownership and safeguard personal property.

(4) The owner of record is responsible and liable to the person who has removed, stored, or otherwise disposed of property impounded pursuant to this section; or

(5) The superintendent may assess the owner reasonable fees for the impoundment and storage of property impounded pursuant to this section.

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(c) *Disposition of property.* (1) Unattended property impounded pursuant to this section shall be deemed to be abandoned unless claimed by the owner or an authorized representative thereof within 60 days. The 60 day period shall begin when the rightful owner of the property has been notified, if the owner can be identified, or from the time the property was placed in the superintendent's custody, if the owner cannot be identified.

(2) Unclaimed found property shall be stored for a minimum period of 60 days and, unless claimed by the owner or an authorized representative thereof, may be claimed by the finder, provided that the finder is not an employee of the National Park Service. Found property which is not claimed by the owner or an authorized representative or the finder shall be deemed abandoned.

(3) Except where State law prescribes a different period of time, paragraphs (c) (1) and (2) shall govern the disposition of property.

(4) Abandoned property shall be disposed of in accordance with Title 41, Code of Federal Regulations.

(5) Property, including real property, located within a park area and owned by a deceased person, shall be disposed of in accordance with the laws of the State within whose exterior boundaries the property is located.

(f) The regulations contained in paragraphs (c), (d) and (e) of this section shall be applicable on privately owned lands under the legislative jurisdiction of the United States.

§ 2.23 Recreation fees.

(a) Recreation fees shall be established as provided for in Part 66 of this chapter.

(b) Entering designated entrance fee areas or using specialized sites, facilities, equipment or services, or participating in group activities, recreation events, or other specialized recreation uses for which recreation fees have been established without paying the required fees and possessing the applicable permits is prohibited. Violation of the terms and conditions of a permit issued under Part 66 may result in revocation of the permit.

(c) The superintendent may, when in the public interest, prescribe periods during which the collection of recreation fees shall be suspended.

§ 2.30 Misappropriation of property and services.

(a) The following are prohibited: (1) Taking or exercising unlawful possession over the property of another with the purpose to deprive the owner thereof.

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(2) Obtaining property or services offered for compensation without making payment or offering to pay therefor.

(3) Obtaining property or services offered for sale or compensation by means of a statement of past, present or future fact which is instrumental in causing the wrongful transfer of property or services, including use of stolen, forged, expired, revoked or fraudulently obtained credit cards or paying with negotiable paper on which payment is refused.

(4) Concealing unpurchased merchandise on or about the person without the knowledge or consent of the seller or paying less than the purchase price by deception.

(5) Acquiring or possessing the property of another, with knowledge or reason to believe that the property is stolen.

(b) The regulations contained in this section shall apply on privately owned lands under the legislative jurisdiction of the United States.

§ 2.31 Trespassing, tampering and vandalism.

(a) The following are prohibited: (1) *Trespassing*. Trespassing, entering or remaining in or upon property or real property not open to the public, except with the express invitation or consent of the person having lawful control of the property or real property.

(2) *Tampering*. Tampering or attempting to tamper with property or real property, or moving, manipulating or setting in motion any of the parts thereof, except when such property is under one's lawful control or possession.

(3) *Vandalism*. Destroying, injuring, defacing, or removing property or real property.

(b) The regulations contained in this section shall be applicable on the privately owned lands under the legislative jurisdiction of the United States.

§ 2.32 Interfering with agency functions.

(a) The following are prohibited: (1) *Interference*. Threatening, resisting, intimidating, or intentionally interfering with a government employee engaged in an official duty.

(2) *Lawful order*. Violating the lawful order of a government employee authorized to maintain order and control public access and movement during fire-fighting operations, search and rescue operations, wildlife management operations involving animals that pose a threat to public safety, law enforcement actions, and emergency operations that involve a threat to public safety.

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(3) **False information.** Knowingly giving a false or fictitious report or other false information to an authorized person investigating an accident or violation of law or regulation.

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(4) **False report.** Knowingly giving a false report for the purpose of misleading a government employee in the conduct of official duties, or making a false report that causes a response by the United States to a fictitious event.

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(b) The regulations in this section shall apply on privately owned lands under the legislative jurisdiction of the United States.

2.23 Report of injury or damage.

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In addition to the requirements of § 3.4 and 4.15 of this chapter, all accidents resulting in injury to persons or damage to property must be reported by the persons involved to an authorized person as soon as possible. Filing this report does not satisfy State accident report requirements.

2.34 Disorderly conduct.

2.7

(a) Disorderly conduct is prohibited.
(b) A person commits disorderly conduct when, with intent to cause alarm, nuisance, jeopardy or annoyance, or knowingly or recklessly creating a risk thereof, such person:
(1) Engages in fighting or threatening, or in violent behavior; or
(2) Uses language, an utterance, or gesture, or engages in a display or act which is obscene, physically threatening or menacing, or done in a manner which is likely to inflict injury or incite an immediate breach of the peace; or
(3) Makes noise which is unreasonable, considering the nature and purpose of the actor's conduct, location, time of day or night, and other factors which would govern the conduct of a reasonably prudent person under the circumstances; or
(4) Creates or maintains a hazardous or physically offensive condition.

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(1) Engages in fighting or threatening, or in violent behavior; or

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(2) Uses language, an utterance, or gesture, or engages in a display or act which is obscene, physically threatening or menacing, or done in a manner which is likely to inflict injury or incite an immediate breach of the peace; or

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(3) Makes noise which is unreasonable, considering the nature and purpose of the actor's conduct, location, time of day or night, and other factors which would govern the conduct of a reasonably prudent person under the circumstances; or

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(4) Creates or maintains a hazardous or physically offensive condition.

2.35 Alcoholic beverages and controlled substances.

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(a) The following are prohibited:

(1) Presence in a park area when under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance to a degree that may endanger oneself or another person, or damage property or park resources.

(2) The sale or gift of an alcoholic beverage to a person under 21 years of age, except where allowed by State law. In a State where a lower minimum age is established, that age limit will apply for purposes of this subparagraph.

(3) The delivery of a controlled substance, except when distribution is made by a practitioner in accordance

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with applicable law. For the purposes of this subparagraph, delivery means the actual, attempted or constructive transfer of a controlled substance, whether or not there exists an agency relationship.

(4) The possession of an alcoholic beverage by a person under 21 years of age, except where allowed by State law. In a State where a lower minimum age is established, that age limit will apply for purposes of this subparagraph.

(5) The possession of a controlled substance, unless such substance was obtained by the possessor directly, or pursuant to a valid prescription or order, from a practitioner acting in the course of professional practice or otherwise allowed by Federal or State law.

(6) The possession while in a motor vehicle of a bottle, can or other receptacle containing an alcoholic beverage which has been opened, had its seal broken, or its contents partially removed.

(b) The superintendent may close public buildings and parking lots, or portions thereof, to the consumption of alcoholic beverage when it is determined that: (1) The consumption of alcohol would be inappropriate considering the use of the location and the purpose for which it is maintained; or (2) Incidences of aberrant behavior related to the consumption of alcohol are of such magnitude that the application of §§ 1.5 (public use limits, visiting hours) and 2.34 (disorderly conduct) do not alleviate the problem. Failure to abide by such a closure is prohibited.

§ 2.36 Gambling.

Gambling in any form, or the operation of gambling devices, is prohibited. This prohibition shall be applicable on the privately owned lands within park areas under the legislative jurisdiction of the United States.

§ 2.37 Noncommercial soliciting.

Asking for or demanding gifts, money, goods or services, is prohibited, except pursuant to the terms and conditions of a permit which has been issued under §§ 2.51 or 2.52.

§ 2.38 Explosives.

(a) Using, possessing, storing, or transporting explosives, blasting agents or explosive materials is prohibited, except pursuant to the terms and conditions of a permit. When permitted, the use, possession, storage and transportation shall be in accordance with applicable Federal and State laws.

(b) Using or possessing fireworks and firecrackers is prohibited, except pursuant to the terms and conditions of

may establish, and in accordance with
applicable State law.
(c) Violation of the terms and
conditions of a permit issued under this
section may result in the revocation of
the permit and such other restrictions as
are prescribed in this chapter.

§ 250 Special events.

(a) Sports events, pageants, regattas,
entertainments, and similar productions
characterized as public spectator
attractions are allowed, provided a
permit therefor has been issued by the
superintendent. The superintendent shall
designate on a map, which shall be
available in the office of the
superintendent, the locations that are
available for special events. Locations
may be designated as not available and
a permit shall be denied if such
activities would:

- (1) Cause injury or damage to park
resources; or
- (2) Be contrary to the purposes for
which the natural, historic, development
and special use zones are maintained; or
- (3) Unreasonably interfere with
interpretive, visitor service, or other
program activities, or with the
administrative functions of the National
Park Service; or
- (4) Substantially impair the operation
of public use facilities or services of
National Park Service concessioners or
contractors; or
- (5) Present a clear and present danger
to the public health and safety; or
- (6) Result in significant conflict with
other existing uses.

(b) An application for such a permit
shall set forth the name of the applicant;
the date, time, duration, nature and
place of the proposed event, an estimate
of the number of persons expected to
attend, and a statement of equipment
and facilities to be used in connection
therewith. The application shall be
submitted so as to reach the
superintendent at least 72 hours in
advance of the proposed event.

(c) As a condition of permit issuance,
the superintendent may require:

- (1) The filing of a bond payable to the
Director, in an amount adequate to cover
costs such as restoration, rehabilitation,
and cleanup of the area used, and other
costs resulting from the special event. In
lieu of a bond, a permittee may elect to
deposit cash equal to the amount of the
required bond.

- (2) In addition to the requirements of
paragraph (c)(1), of this section, the
acquisition of liability insurance in
which the United States is named as co-
insured in an amount sufficient to
protect the United States, and

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(d) The permit may contain such conditions as are reasonably consistent with the protection and use of the park area for the purposes for which it is maintained. It may also contain reasonable limitations on the equipment used and the time and area within which the event is allowed.

(e) Violation of the terms and conditions of a permit issued under this section may result in the revocation of the permit and such other restrictions as are prescribed in this chapter.

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2.51 Public assemblies, meetings.

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(a) Public meetings, assemblies, gatherings, demonstrations, parades and other public expressions of views are allowed within park areas, provided a permit therefor has been issued by the superintendent.

(b) An application for such a permit shall set forth the name of the applicant, the date, time, duration, nature and place of the proposed event, an estimate of the number of persons expected to attend, and a statement of equipment and facilities to be used in connection therewith. The application shall be submitted so as to reach the superintendent at least 48 hours in advance of the proposed event.

(c) The superintendent shall, within 48 hours, issue a permit on proper application unless:

(1) A prior application for a permit for the same time and place has been made which has been or will be granted and the activities authorized by that permit do not reasonably allow multiple occupancy of that particular area; or

(2) It reasonably appears that the event will present a clear and present danger to the public health or safety; or

(3) The event is of such nature or location that it cannot reasonably be accommodated in the particular location applied for, considering possible damage to park resources or facilities, impairment of a protected area's atmosphere, of peace and tranquility, interference with program activities, or impairment of public use facilities.

(d) The superintendent shall designate on a map, which shall be available in the office of the superintendent, the locations that are available for public assemblies. Locations may be designated as not available only if such activities would:

(1) Cause injury or damage to park resources; or

(2) Be contrary to the purposes for which the natural, historic, development and special use zones are maintained; or

(3) Unreasonably interfere with interpretive, visitor service, or other program activities, or with the

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administrative functions of the National Service; or
Substantially impair the operation of public use facilities or services of National Park Service concessioners or contractors; or

(5) Present a clear and present danger to the public health and safety.

(c) The permit may contain such conditions as are reasonably consistent with protection and use of the park area for the purposes for which it is maintained. It may also contain reasonable limitations on the equipment used and the time and area within which the event is allowed.

(f) Violation of the terms and conditions of a permit issued under this section may result in the revocation of the permit and such other restrictions as are prescribed in this chapter.

§ 2.52 Sale and distribution of printed matter.

(a) The sale or distribution of printed matter is allowed within park areas, provided that a permit to do so has been issued by the superintendent, and provided further that the printed matter is not solely commercial advertising.

(b) An application for such a permit shall set forth the name of the applicant, the name of the organization (if any), the date, time, duration, and location of the proposed sale or distribution, and the number of participants. The application shall be submitted so as to reach the superintendent at least 48 hours in advance of the proposed sale or distribution.

(c) The superintendent shall, within 48 hours, issue a permit on proper application unless:

(1) A prior application for a permit for the same time and location has been made which has been or will be granted and the activities authorized by that permit do not reasonably allow multiple occupancy of the particular area; or

(2) It reasonably appears that the sale or distribution will present a clear and present danger to the public health and safety; or

(3) The number of persons engaged in the sale or distribution exceeds the number that can reasonably be accommodated in the particular location applied for, considering possible damage to park resources or facilities, impairment of a protected area's atmosphere of peace and tranquility, interference with program activities, or impairment of public use facilities; or

(4) The location applied for has not been designated as available for the sale or distribution of printed matter; or

(5) The activity would constitute a violation of an applicable law or regulation.

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(d) If an application for a permit is denied, the applicant shall be so informed in writing, with the reason(s) for the denial set forth.

(e) The superintendent shall designate on a map, which shall be available for inspection in the office of the superintendent, the locations within the park area that are available for the sale or distribution of printed matter. Locations may be designated as not available only if the sale or distribution of printed matter would:

(1) Cause injury or damage to park resources; or

(2) Be contrary to the purposes for which the natural, historic, development and special use zones are maintained; or

(3) Unreasonably interfere with interpretive, visitor service, or other program activities, or with the administrative function of the National Park Service; or

(4) Substantially impair the operation of public use facilities or services of National Park Service concessioners or contractors.

(f) The permit may contain such conditions as are reasonably consistent with protection and use of the park area for the purposes for which it is maintained.

(g) No permit shall be issued for a period in excess of 14 consecutive days, provided that permits may be extended for like periods, upon a new application, unless another applicant has requested use of the same location and multiple occupancy of that location is not reasonably possible.

(h) Persons engaged in the sale or distribution of printed matter under this section shall not obstruct or impede pedestrians or vehicles, harass park visitors with physical contact or persistent demands, misrepresent the purposes or affiliations of those engaged in the sale or distribution, or misrepresent whether the printed matter is available without cost or donation.

(i) A permit may be revoked under any of those conditions, as listed in paragraph (e) of this section, which constitute grounds for denial of a permit, or for violation of the terms and conditions of the permit. Such a revocation shall be made in writing, with the reason(s) for revocation clearly set forth, except under emergency circumstances, when an immediate verbal revocation or suspension may be made, to be followed by written confirmation.

(j) Violation of the terms and conditions of a permit issued under this section may result in revocation of the permit and such other restrictions as are prescribed in this chapter.

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§ 260 Grazing and agriculture.

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(a) The following are prohibited: (1) The running at large, herding, driving across, allowing on, or grazing of livestock of any kind in a park area, except pursuant to the terms and conditions of a permit or lease.

(2) The use of a park area for agricultural purposes, except pursuant to the terms and conditions of a permit or lease.

(3) Violation of the terms and conditions of a permit or lease issued under this paragraph.

(b) Violation of the terms and conditions of a permit issued under paragraph (a) may result in revocation of the permit and such other restrictions as are prescribed in this chapter.

(c) Impounding of livestock. (1) Livestock trespassing in a park area may be impounded by the superintendent and, if not claimed by the owner within the period specified in this paragraph, shall be disposed of in accordance with applicable Federal and State law.

(2) In the absence of applicable Federal or State law, the livestock shall be disposed of in the following manner:

(i) If the owner is known, prompt written notice of impoundment will be served, and in the event of the owner's failure to remove the impounded livestock within five (5) days from delivery of such notice, it will be disposed of in accordance with this paragraph.

(ii) If the owner is unknown, disposal of the livestock shall not be made until at least fifteen (15) days have elapsed from the date that a notice of impoundment is originally published in a newspaper of general circulation in the county in which the trespass occurs, or if no such newspaper exists, notification is provided by other appropriate means.

(iii) The owner may redeem the livestock by submitting proof of ownership and paying all expenses of the United States for capturing, advertising, pasturing, feeding, impounding, and the amount of damage to public property injured or destroyed as a result of the trespass.

(iv) In determining the claim of the government in a livestock trespass, the value of forage consumed shall be computed at the commercial rates prevailing in the locality for the class of livestock found in trespass. The claim shall include the pro rata salary of employees for the time spent and the expenses incurred as a result of the investigation, reporting, and settlement or prosecution of the claim.

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(v) If livestock impounded under this paragraph is offered at public sale and no bid is received, or if the highest bid received is less than the amount of the claim of the United States or of the officer's appraised value of the livestock, whichever is the lesser amount, such livestock may be sold at private sale for the highest amount obtainable, condemned and destroyed, or converted to the use of the United States if of value for that purpose.

§ 2.61 Reskling on Federal lands.

5.15

The following are prohibited:

(a) Reskling in park areas, other than on privately owned lands, except pursuant to the terms and conditions of a permit, lease or contract.

(b) Violation of the terms and conditions of a lease or contract issued under this section.

(c) Violation of the terms and conditions of a permit issued under this section may result in revocation of the permit and such other restrictions as are prescribed in this chapter.

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§ 2.62 Memorialization.

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(a) The installation of a monument, memorial, tablet, structure, or other commemorative installation in a park area without the authorization of the Director is prohibited.

(b) The scattering of human ashes from cremation is prohibited, except pursuant to the terms and conditions of a permit, or in designated areas according to conditions which may be established by the superintendent.

(c) Failure to abide by area designations and established conditions is prohibited.

(d) Violation of the terms and conditions of a permit issued under this section may result in the revocation of the permit and such other restrictions as are prescribed in this chapter.

§ 3.1 Applicable regulations.

(a) In addition to the regulations contained in this part, Title 33, United States Code; Title 46, United States

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Code: Title 33, Code of Federal Regulations; Title 46, Code of Federal Regulations; and the laws and regulations of the State within whose exterior boundaries a park area or portion thereof is located shall govern water use, vessels, and their operation. Such Federal and State laws and regulations which are now or may hereafter be in effect are adopted and made a part of these regulations.

(b) As adopted herein Federal regulations which authorize an action by the "captain of the port" or another officer or employee of the United States Coast Guard, authorize a like action by the superintendent.

§ 1.2 National Park Service distinctive identification.

(a) The distinctive identification insignia of National Park Service vessels shall consist of the following:

(1) Three adjacent diagonal stripes running from the waterline to the gunwale on both port and starboard topsides approximately quarter length from the bow. The stripes are set at an angle of 30 vertical, approximately parallel to the bow. The insignia consists of a broad forest green stripe followed by two narrow white and forest green stripes respectively. Width of the broad green stripe shall be $\frac{1}{4}$ the vertical distance between gunwale and waterline. The narrow white and green stripes are $\frac{1}{8}$ and $\frac{1}{11}$ the width of the main green stripe respectively.

(2) The National Park Service arrowhead symbol, described in 36 CFR Part 11, centered within the confines of the broad green diagonal stripe.

(3) The words "National Park Service" in contrasting color to vessel hull which is white, and utilized in place of State identification/registration numbers on the bow.

(b) Carrying or displaying an ensign, or other identifying insignia which is identical to or resembles those prescribed for National Park Service vessels, is prohibited.

§ 1.3 Permits.

(a) The superintendent may require a permit for use of vessels within park areas.

(b) Violation of the terms and conditions of a permit issued under this section may result in revocation of the permit and such other restrictions as are prescribed in this chapter.

§ 1.4 Accidents.

(a) All incidents involving an accident, collision, fire or other casualty shall be reported to the superintendent within 24 hours. Filing this report does not satisfy applicable United States

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Coast Guard State and county accident
report requirements.
(b) Failure to report an incident to the
superintendent within 24 hours is
prohibited.

§ 3.5 Inspections.

(a) Authorized persons may at any
time stop or board a vessel to examine
documents, licenses or permits relating
to operation of the vessel; and to inspect
such vessel to determine compliance
with regulations pertaining to safety
equipment and operation.

(b) An authorized person who
observes a vessel being operated
without sufficient lifesaving or
firefighting devices, or in an overloaded
or unsafe condition, as defined in U.S.
Coast Guard or National Park Service
regulations, may direct the operator to
take immediate and reasonable steps
necessary for the safety of those aboard
the vessel, including but not limited to
directing the operator to:

(1) Correct the hazardous condition
immediately;

(2) Proceed to a mooring, dock, or
anchorage; or

(3) Suspend further use of the boat
until the hazardous condition is
corrected.

(c) Violation of such directions is
prohibited.

§ 3.6 Prohibited operations.

The following are prohibited:

(a) Operating a vessel, or knowingly
allowing another person to operate a
vessel, in a reckless or negligent
manner, or in a manner so as to
endanger or be likely to endanger a
person or property.

(b) Operating a vessel when under the
influence of alcohol or controlled
substance to a degree that may
endanger oneself or another person or
damage property or park resources.

(c) Failing to observe restrictions
established by a regulatory marker.

(d) Operating a vessel in excess of 5
mph or creating a wake in designated
areas or in the vicinity of a diver's
marker, downed water skier or
swimmer.

(e) Operation of a vessel propelled by
machinery within 500 feet of a
designated swimming beach. This
prohibition does not apply in locations
such as rivers, channels, or narrow
coves where passage is restricted to less
than 500 feet. In such areas, the
operation of a vessel in excess of 5 mph
or creating a wake is prohibited.

(f) Allowing a person to ride on the
gunwales, transom, or on the decking
over the bow of a vessel propelled by
machinery, operating in excess of 5 mph.

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provided however, that this provision shall not apply under the following circumstances:

(1) When that portion of the vessel was designed and constructed for the purpose of carrying passengers safely at all speeds;

(2) When the vessel is being maneuvered for anchoring, mooring or casting off moorings;

(g) Attaching a vessel to or interfering with a marker, navigation buoy or other navigational aid;

(h) Using trailers to launch or recover vessels, except at designated launching sites;

(i) Launching a vessel propelled by machinery at other than designated launch sites;

(j) The launching or operating of airboats.

§ 3.7 Noise abatement

Operating a vessel in or upon inland waters so as to exceed a noise level of 82 decibels measured at a distance of 50 feet from the vessel is prohibited. Testing procedures employed to determine such noise levels shall be in accordance with or equal to the Exterior Sound Level Measurement Procedure for Vessels recommended by the Society of Automotive Engineers SAE J34 (April 1973).

§ 3.20 Water skiing

(a) The towing of persons on water skis, surfboards, parasails, or similar devices by vessels is prohibited, except in designated waters.

(b) Where towing is authorized, the following are prohibited:

(1) Towing between the hours of sunset and sunrise.

(2) Towing without one person [other than the operator] observing the progress of the person being towed.

(3) Towing a person who is not wearing a personal flotation device. If the person being towed is wearing a flotation device which is not approved by the United States Coast Guard, there must be an approved personal flotation

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device readily available in the towing vessel.

(4) Towing in channels or within 500 feet of designated harbors, swimming beaches, mooring areas or within 100 feet of a person fishing or swimming.

§ 3.21 Swimming and bathing.

(a) The following are prohibited:

(1) Swimming or bathing in closed areas.

(2) Swimming or bathing in violation of designated restrictions.

(3) Swimming from vessels which are underway, except in circumstances where a capable operator is on board and all propulsion machinery is off and/or sails are furled.

(b) The superintendent may prohibit the use of flotation devices within designated swimming beaches.

§ 3.22 Surfing.

The use of surfboards and similar rigid devices within designated swimming beaches is prohibited.

§ 3.23 Scuba and snorkeling.

The following are prohibited:

(a) SCUBA and snorkeling within designated swimming, docking, or mooring areas, except in accordance with conditions which may be established by the superintendent.

(b) Diving without displaying a standard diver flag.

SUBPART A - GENERAL PROHIBITIONS

261.3 INTERFERING WITH OR GIVING FALSE REPORT TO A FOREST OFFICER.

The following are prohibited:

- (a) Threatening, resisting, intimidating, or interfering with any Forest Officer engaged in or on account of the performance of his official duties in the protection, improvement, or administration of the National Forest System is prohibited. M
- (b) Giving any false, fictitious or fraudulent report or other information to any Forest Officer engaged in or on account of the performance of his official duties knowing that such report or other information contains false, fictitious or fraudulent statement or entry. M

261.4 DISORDERLY CONDUCT.

The following are prohibited:

- (a) Engaging in fighting. 50
- (b) Addressing any offensive, derisive, or annoying communication to any other person who is lawfully present when such communication has a direct tendency to cause acts of violence by the person to whom, individually, the remark is addressed 50
- (c) Make statements or other actions directed toward inciting or producing imminent lawless action and likely to incite or produce such action 50
- (d) Causing public inconvenience, annoyance or alarm by making unreasonably loud noise 50

261.5 FIRE.

The following are prohibited:

- (a) Carelessly or negligently throwing or placing any ignited substance or other substance that may cause a fire. 75
- (b) Firing any tracer bullet or incendiary ammunition 75
- (c) Causing timber, trees, slash, brush or grass to burn except as authorized by permit. 75
- (d) Leaving a fire without completely extinguishing it. 75
- (e) Allowing a fire to escape from control. M
- (f) Building, attending, maintaining, or using a campfire without removing all flammable material from around the campfire adequate to prevent its escape. 50

261.6 TIMBER AND OTHER FOREST PRODUCTS.

The following are prohibited:

- (a) Cutting or otherwise damaging any timber, tree or other forest product, except as authorized by permit, timber sale contract, Federal law or regulation 50
- (b) Cutting any standing tree, under permit or timber sale contract, before a Forest Officer has marked it or has otherwise designated it for cutting 75

- (c) Removing any timber or other forest product cut under permit or timber sale contract, except to a place designated for scaling, or removing it from that place before it is scaled, measured, counted, or otherwise accounted for by a Forest Officer 75
- (d) Stamping, marking with paint, or otherwise identifying any tree or other forest product in a manner similar to that employed by Forest Officers to mark or designate a tree or any other forest product for cutting or removal. M
- (e) Loading, removing or hauling timber or other forest product acquired under any permit or timber sale contract unless such product is identified as required in such permit or contract. 75
- (f) Selling or exchanging any timber or other forest product obtained under free use pursuant to paragraph (e), (f), or (g) of Section 223.1. 75
- (g) Violating any timber export or substitution restriction in Section 223.10. 75
- (h) Removing any timber, tree, or other forest product, except as authorized by permit, timber sale contract Federal law or regulation. 75

261.7 LIVESTOCK.

The following are prohibited:

- (a) Placing or allowing unauthorized livestock to enter or be in the National Forest System or other lands under Forest Service control. 40
- (b) Not removing unauthorized livestock from the National Forest System or other lands under Forest Service control when requested by a Forest Officer 40
- (c) Failing to reclose any gate or other entry. 25
- (d) Molesting, injuring, removing, or releasing any livestock impounded under Section 262.2 while in the custody of the Forest Service or its authorized agents M

261.8 FISH AND WILDLIFE.

The following are prohibited to the extent Federal or State law is violated:

- (a) Hunting, trapping, fishing, catching, molesting, killing or having in possession any kind of wild animal, bird, or fish, or taking the eggs of any such bird. 75
- (b) Possessing a firearm or other implement designed to discharge a missile capable of destroying animal life 75
- (c) Possessing equipment that could be used for hunting, fishing, or trapping. 50
- (d) Possessing a dog not on a leash or otherwise confined 50

261.9 PROPERTY.

The following are prohibited:

- (a) Damaging any natural feature or other property of the United States. 50

- (b) Removing any natural feature or other property of the United States. 75
- (c) Damaging any plant that is classified as a threatened, endangered, sensitive, rare, or unique species. 60
- (d) Removing any plant that is classified as a threatened, endangered, sensitive, rare, or unique species. 60

- (f) Using any herbicide, pesticide or fungicide except for personal use for medical purposes or as an insect repellent or with permission for other minor uses. 50
- (g) Digging in, excavating, disturbing, injuring, destroying, or in any way damaging any paleontological, prehistoric, historic or archaeological resource, structure, site, artifact or property. M
- (h) Removing any paleontological, prehistoric, historic, or archaeological resource, structure, site, artifact or property. M

261.10 OCCUPANCY AND USE.

The following are prohibited:

- (a) Constructing, placing, or maintaining any kind of road, trail structure, fence, enclosure, communication equipment, or other improvement without a permit. 50
- (b) Taking possession of, occupying, or otherwise using National Forest System lands for residential purposes without a permit or as otherwise authorized by Federal law or regulation. M
- (c) Selling or offering for sale any merchandise, conducting any kind of work activity or service unless authorized by Federal law, regulation, or permit. 50
- (d) Discharging a firearm or any other implement capable of taking human life, causing injury, or damaging property: (1) In or within 150 yards of a residence, building, campsite, developed recreation site or occupied area, or (2) across or on a Forest Development road or a body of water adjacent thereto, or in any manner or place whereby any person or property is exposed to injury or damage as a result in such discharge. 75
- (e) Abandoning any personal property. 75
- (f) Placing a vehicle or other object in such a manner that it is an impediment or hazard to the safety or convenience of any person. 50
- (g) Posting, placing, or erecting any paper, notice, advertising material, sign, or similar matter without a permit. 25
- (h) Operating or using in or near a campsite, developed recreation site, or over an adjacent body of water without a permit, any device which produces noise, such as a radio, television, musical instrument, motor or engine in such a manner and at such a time so as to unreasonably disturb any person. 25
- (i) Operating or using a public address system, whether fixed, portable, or vehicle mounted, in or near a campsite, developed recreation site, or over an adjacent body of water without a permit. 25

(j) Conducting, demonstrating, or participating in a public meeting, assembly, or special event, except as authorized by permit.	25
(k) Violating any term or condition of a permit	50
(l) Failing to stop a vehicle when directed to do so by a Forest Officer	50

261.11 SANITATION.

The following are prohibited:

(a) Depositing in any toilet, toilet vault, or plumbing fixture any substance which could damage or interfere with the operation or maintenance of the fixture.	40

261.17 BOUNDARY WATERS CANOE AREA, SUPERIOR NATIONAL FOREST.

The following are prohibited in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area:

- (a) Possessing or transporting any motor or other mechanical device capable of propelling a watercraft through water by any means, except by permit or as specifically authorized by Federal law or regulation.
- (b) Transporting, using, or mooring amphibious craft of any type or any watercraft designed for or used as floating living quarters
- (c) Using wheels, rollers, or other mechanical devices for the overland transportation of any watercraft, except by permit or as specifically authorized by Federal law or regulation

261.18 PACIFIC CREST NATIONAL SCENIC TRAIL.

It is prohibited to use a motorized vehicle on the Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail without a permit 50

261.19 NATIONAL FOREST PRIMITIVE AREAS.

The following are prohibited in any area classified as a National Forest Primitive Area on September 3, 1964:

- (a) Landing of aircraft or using a motor boat, unless such use had become well established before September 3, 1964. M
- (b) Possessing or using a motor or motorized equipment, except small battery powered, hand-held devices, such as cameras, shavers, flashlights, and Geiger-counters. 50

261.20 UNAUTHORIZED USE OF "SMOKEY BEAR" AND "WOODSY OWL" SYMBOL.

- (a) Manufacture, importation, reproduction, or use of "Smokey Bear" except as provided under Sections 271.2, 271.3, or 271.4 is prohibited. 50

- (b) Manufacture, importation, reproduction, or use of "Woodsy Owl" except as provided under Sections 272.2, 272.3, or 272.4 is prohibited. 50

261.21 WILD FREE-ROAMING HORSES AND BURROS.

The following are prohibited:

- (a) Removing or attempting to remove a wild free-roaming horse or burro from the National Forest System unless authorized by law or regulation 75
- (b) Causing or allowing the inhumane treatment or harassment of a wild free-roaming horse or burro. M
- (c) Removing or attempting to remove, alter or destroy any official mark used to identify a wild horse or burro or its remains unless authorized or permitted by law or regulation 75
- (d) Violating any terms or conditions specified in a care and maintenance agreement or permit 50

SUBPART B - PROHIBITIONS IN AREAS DESIGNATED BY ORDER

261.52 FIRE.

When provided by an order, the following are prohibited:

- (a) Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire. 50
- (b) Using an explosive. 75

- (j) Operating or using any internal or external combustion engine without a spark arresting device properly installed, maintained and in effective working order meeting either: (1) Department of Agriculture, Forest Service Standard 5100-1a; or (2) appropriate Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE) recommended practice J335(b) and J350(a) 75
- (k) Violating any state law specified in the order concerning burning, fires or which is for the purpose of preventing, or restricting the spread of fires 75

261.53 SPECIAL CLOSURES.

When provided in an order, it is prohibited to go into or be upon any area which is closed for the protection of:

- (a) Threatened, endangered, rare, unique, or vanishing species of plants, animals, birds or fish. 50
- (b) Special biological communities. 50
- (c) Objects or areas of historical, archaeological, geological, or paleontological interest authorization. 50
- (d) Scientific experiments or investigations. 50
- (e) Public health or safety 50
- (f) Property. 50

261.54 FOREST DEVELOPMENT ROADS.

When provided by an order, the following are prohibited:

- (a) Using any type of vehicle prohibited by the order 35
- (b) Use by any type of traffic prohibited by the order. 35
- (c) Using a road for commercial hauling without a permit or written authorization 50
- (d) Operating a vehicle in violation of the speed, load, weight, height, length, width, or other limitations specified by the order 50
- (e) Being on the road 50
- (f) Operating a vehicle carelessly, recklessly, or without regard for the rights or safety of other persons or in a manner or at a speed that would endanger or be likely to endanger any person or property. 75

261.55 FOREST DEVELOPMENT TRAILS.

When provided by an order, the following are prohibited:

- (a) Being on the trail. 30
- (b) Using a bicycle or motorized vehicle. 30
- (c) Possessing or using a saddle, pack, or draft animal 30
- (d) Shortcutting a switchback 30

261.56 USE OF VEHICLES OFF FOREST DEVELOPMENT ROADS.

When provided by an order, it is prohibited to possess or use a vehicle off forest development roads 50

261.57 NATIONAL FOREST WILDERNESS.

When provided by an order, the following are prohibited:

- (a) Entering or being in the area 40
- (b) Possessing camping or pack-out-fitting equipment, as specified in the order. 35
- (c) Possessing a firearm or firework. 40
- (d) Possessing any non-burnable food or beverage containers, including deposit bottles, except for non-burnable containers designed and intended for repeated use. 35

(e) Grazing	50
