Amending General Orders No. 26 and 57

Daily transcript has been defined by the Judicial Conference of the United States as a transcript of each day's proceedings to be delivered following adjournment and prior to the normal opening hour of the court on the following morning whether or not it actually be a court day. The same definition is adopted by this court.
