POLICY REGARDING DEFENDANTS IN CUSTODY

(Effective September 1, 2010)

Until further notice, and except during the Magistrate Judges' absence from Yosemite National Park, the U.S. Magistrate Court in Yosemite National Park will be available to hear matters involving defendants in custody at 1:30 p.m. daily. The following procedures for these matters shall be followed by the U.S. Government, its agencies and representatives, and by defense counsel:

- 1. A representative for the National Park Service ("NPS") shall notify the Court and the Federal Defender by 8:30 a.m. if there are individuals in custody to be brought before the Court for initial appearance that day. If there are, the Court shall also be notified at that time of the number and sex of the individual(s) in custody, whether any court interpreter(s) is (are) needed, and whether there is reason to believe that any individual in custody is under the influence of alcohol or drugs or otherwise of questionable competency.
 - 2. The Government shall file with the Clerk's Office by 10:00 a.m. all documents

pertinent to a 1:30 p.m. court appearance for an individual in custody (redacted in compliance with the Local Rules of the Eastern District of California), including proposed complaints, if any. The Government's representative shall appear before the U.S. Magistrate Judge at 10:00 a.m. to have any complaints sworn and signed. The Government shall provide copies of all documents referred to in this paragraph to defense counsel or, if none has then been retained, to the Assistant Federal Defender by 11:00 a.m.

- 3. The Court will communicate and coordinate with the NPS Holding Facility staff as necessary to obtain additional information needed by the Court regarding the in-custody individual(s) and to advise of changes, if any, in procedures for and/or timing of transporting those individuals to the Court. The procedures set out below are designed to apply when there are only one or two individuals to be transported to the Court in one day and neither requires unusual accommodation (e.g., requires an interpreter, faces complex charges, is one of two co-defendants on the same complaint or citation, etc.)
- 4. Unless the Court directs otherwise, the NPS Holding Facility shall transport any in-custody defendant scheduled for an initial appearance to the Court not later than 12:30 p.m. Defense counsel shall be present at the Court and available to meet with their clients not later than 12:30 p.m..
- 5. Unless the defendant or his/her counsel request otherwise, an in-custody defendant's blood alcohol level or apparent state of intoxication shall not delay transporting that individual to the Court.
- 6. Absent extraordinary circumstances as determined by the Court, daily proceedings for in-custody defendants shall begin at 1:30 p.m. sharp.
